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AN ACT to confer certain powers upon the inhabitants and officers of the town of Eden.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. The inhabitants of the town of  
2 Eden may make by-laws and ordinances for the  
3 proper regulation and inspection of the drivers,  
4 horses, harnesses, and vehicles engaged or used in  
5 the carriage of persons for hire in the town of  
6 Eden; for establishing the rates of fare, their  
7 routes, standing places, and in other respects; and  
8 requiring all persons engaging in the business  
9 of carrying persons for hire, by horses and car-  
10 riages, within said town, to obtain license therefor  
11 from the municipal officers; and fixing the terms  
12 and conditions of such licensing, and a reasonable

13 fee therefor not exceeding five dollars, to be paid  
14 into the town treasury; and provide for the en-  
15 forcement of such by-laws and ordinances by suit-  
16 able penalties, not exceeding ten dollars for each  
17 offence.

SECT. 2. The municipal officers of the town of  
2 Eden, shall have the power to appoint special con-  
3 stables for said town not exceeding six in number,  
4 which constables shall have all the power of police-  
5 men in cities, and may serve warrants issued in  
6 criminal cases.

SECT. 3. This act shall not be in force, however,  
2 unless accepted by the town of Eden at its next  
3 annual town meeting.
