Voted that the Selectmen instruct the collector to pay in to the treasury 1/4 of the cash assessment for the present, by the first of July 1/4 first October 1/4 by first of January 1/4 first of March next

Voted that Edwin and Elvin Young be allowed to draw their proportion of school money from Dist No 8

Voted that the Selectmen employ some competent man at Augusta to oppose the petition of Wm Thompson praying <sup>of the Legislature</sup> to be annexed to the Town of Chenton and also that they instruct our Representative and Senator to the next session of the Legislature to use their influence against the same

Voted that \$5.37 be carried in against the estate of Seth J. Bemick now under administration in favor of the Town it being due for taxes and that the above sum be given by the administrator to the widow

Voted that an abatement of \$3,62 be allowed Richard Higgins it being taxes due the town from various persons
