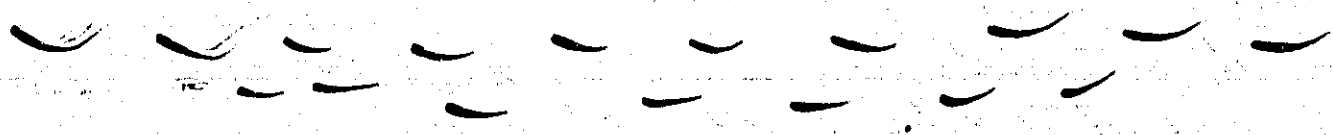

The undersigned, Selectmen of the town of Eden
 having been requested by petition to locate a town
 road, commencing near the premises of Randall
 Clark on the Duck Brook stream in Eden and
 terminating at some convenient place at the town
 or County road near the shore; have examined the
 route proposed, after having given legal notice of their
 intention as the Statutes provide, and have located
 a town road in accordance with the request of the
 petitioners, commencing at or near the sawmill on
 Duck Brook stream at a stake, and runs first
 North, fifteen degrees East, ten rods
 then North forty four degrees East fourteen rods
 " North thirty two degrees East twenty two rods
 " North fifty eight degrees East fourteen rods
 " North thirty two degrees East twelve rods
 " North four degrees East twelve rods
 " North twenty nine degrees East twenty rods
 " North fifteen degrees East sixteen rods
 " North thirty three rods
 " North thirty six degrees East ten rods
 " South eighty eight degrees East ten rods to a
 Pine tree: then North fifty four degrees East twelve rods
 to forks of old road—
 then North forty eight & a half degrees East ten rods
 " North twenty degrees East sixteen rods
 " North fifteen degrees East eight rods, making a
 distance of road to be made of two hundred and
 ninety rods—said road to be three rods in
 width, and the line surveyed to be on the ~~left~~
 Northernly and Westernly side of said road.

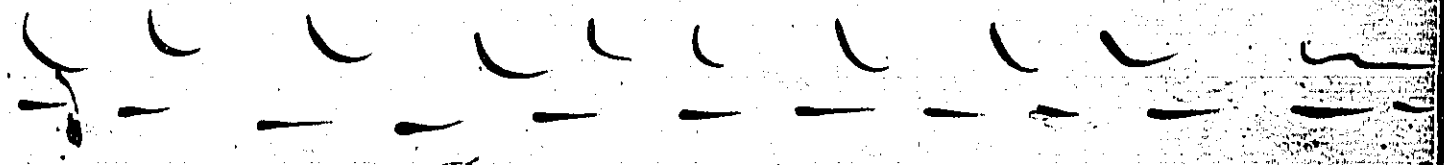

Report of
Town Road from Hull's Cove to
Joseph Hopkins, Feb. 12, 1855.

The undersigned, Selectmen of the town
of Eden, having been requested by Joseph
Hopkins of said Eden to locate a town road
from his house to the town road at Hull's
Cove, have examined the route, and located a
town road as follows: Beginning at the
town road, at Hull's Cove, on the line be-
tween Richard Hamor & heirs of Benjamin
Peach, and following said line & Alden Ho-
mois line, making the same the middle
of the road, North, fifty degrees West, seventy
four rods; then South, sixty degrees West,
thirty seven rods, to corner of Augustus
Hamor's & Joseph Hopkins lots, making the

whole distance one hundred & eleven rods,
 & have laid out the same three rods wide - ac-
 -cording to plan and survey of Leonard J
 Thomas, Surveyor - and have estimated the
 damage to each individual to be as follows
 To Heirs of Benjamin Peck, fifteen Dollars
 - to Alden Hamor five dollars and to Ric-
 -ard Hamor five Dollars

 but the said Benjamin Emery thro' requested
 so to do has refused to divide the line.
 You are therefore requested to divide and af-
 sign the same in the way and manner by
 law provided.

Whereas Thomas Emery of the town of Eden
 did represent to us Fence Viewers of said town
 that he was desirous of improving a certain
 parcel of land situated on the South side of the
 Highway and west side of land owned by Benjn.
 Emery which has been improved in common with
 a certain piece of land occupied by Benjn. Emery
 and to have a partition fence between the said lands
 and that the said Benjn. Emery has refused the
 line where the fence ought to be built and did re-
 quest us to divide and assign the same in the
 way and manner by law provided, Therefore
 having given due notice to the said Benjn. Emery
 have divided and assigned and do hereby divide and
 assign said line as follows, to wit,

The said Thomas Emery shall build and main-
 tain a fence on the line beginning at the head line
 of John Rich's farm then running Northw'dly on
 line between Benjn. & Thomas Emery 45 rods to a
 spruce tree then to the middle of the creek in
 the woods, also one other piece of fence on said line
 beginning at the creek on the meadow running
 Northw'dly 25 rods to a spruce tree on said line
 and that the said Benjn. Emery build and main-
 tain a fence on the other part of the line, viz.
 beginning at the highway and running Southw'dly
 25 rods to a spruce tree on said line also
 from the creek in the meadow Southw'dly 45
 rods to a birch tree on said line then from

birch tree to the middle of the creek in the woods. And we hereby assign the space of thirty days from the date hereof for making up the fence as aforesaid whereof the several parties are to take notice
