And having met at the time and place appointed for that purpose and having personally examined the route proposed are of the opinion that there is occasion for a private way for the use of John H. & Abram Richardson as proposed. We therefore lay out said way as follows. Beginning at a stake on land owned by Hamash running hence running south 1¹/₂ deg. West 39¹/₂ rods to a stake hence South 13 deg.
