

Art. 53. Voted: That said article be indefinitely postponed.

Art. 54. Voted: To raise \$500.00 to repair the Breakneck road.

Art. 55. Voted: To indefinitely postpone said article.

Art. 56. Voted: To indefinitely postpone said article.

Art. 57. Voted: To raise \$1,500.00 to construct repair sewers at Bar Harbor.

Art. 58. Voted: That three fourths of the money raised for repairs of roads and bridges shall be expended under contract by the Road Commissioners.

Art. 59. Voted: That to tax dogs over six months old one dollar (\$1.00) each.

Art. 60. Voted: That Art. 60 be indefinitely postponed.

Art. 61. Voted: To authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to close their accounts on the first day of February in each year and make a printed report of the same.

Voted: That the Selectmen be a Committee to settle with the town treasurer at the close of the financial year.

Art. 62. Voted: To instruct the Selectmen to make a contract with the "Bar Harbor Water Company", to supply the town with water for fire and municipal purposes for a term of ten years.

Art. 63. Voted: That the matter of fixing a price for said water supply be referred to the next Annual Town Meeting, and that the Selectmen be a committee to report to said Annual meeting upon an equitable price for said water supply.

Art. 64. Voted: That the Selectmen be authorized to contract with the "Bar Harbor Illuminating Co." for a sufficient number of Arc or Incandescent Lights, to light the streets of Bar Harbor during the ensuing year for such a number of nights, and for such a number of hours of each night as they may deem sufficient, at a price not exceeding twelve hundred dollars. (\$1200.)

Art. 65. Voted: To indefinitely postpone the enlarging of Lock up.

Art. 66. Voted: That the matter of heating the School house on School Street, Bar Harbor be indefinitely postponed.

After the discussing of the last article on the warrant, it was moved by E. J. Hamor that the Selectmen be authorized to visit each Saloon-keeper and ask them to depart from the place.

Voted: That a vote of thanks be extended to the Moderator, Rev. A. F. Palmer for the able and impartial manner in which he had presided - and that the selectmen be instructed to pay him such reasonable sum as they should see fit for his services

All the business having been transacted it was then
Voted: To adjourn without date.

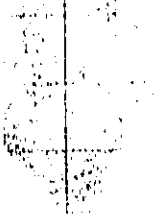
