Report of Annual Meeting of the town of Eden,
held at Music Hall, Bar Harbor,
March. 1890. -

In accordance with the foregoing warrant the inhabitants of Eden "qualified by law to vote in town affairs" assembled on Monday March 3, 1890, at ten o'clock A. M. at Music Hall, in Bar Harbor, and proceeded to business as follows: -

Article 1. - Voted. That A. F. Palmer be Moderator to preside at said meeting, and he was duly sworn by the Town Clerk.

Article 2. - Voted: That Samuel N. Rich be Town Clerk for the ensuing year, and he was sworn by the Moderator.

Article 3. - On motion of Mr. Eben W. Hamer the following resolution was unanimously adopted;

Resolved: That the legal voters of the town of Eden, in legal town meeting assembled, hereby request and instruct the Selectmen, Constables and Policemen of said town to use all legal means in their power to prevent the sale (or giving away) of any intoxicating liquors in Bar Harbor and especially in and around this hall during the session of this meeting.

said company in consideration of water
furnished for streets, sewers, and drinking

The above mentioned sums to be paid
said company, under the contract already
voted to be made.

After the foregoing vote was passed, it
was doubled by John J. Higgins, whereupon
a second vote was called for by a division
of the house, which vote was the same

as the previous vote. — This not being satisfactory, Mr. Higgins asked that the check list be called and that each man voting should have placed against his name the word "Yes" or "No" to ^{determine} either as he might vote for or against the first vote under Article 49.
