Resolved: That it is the sense of this meeting that the Selectmen be a Committee to examine the condition of our School System, and determine whether we are properly and legally under the Town system, (so-called) and if proper and necessary, make a case to be made, an appraisement of the School property in the town, and report at the next Annual town meeting.

Voted: That it is the sense of this House that a vote of thanks be extended to the Moderator for the able manner in which he has conducted this meeting, and that the Selectmen be instructed to pay him the usual fee for such services.

Report of the Perambulation of the line between Mt. Desert and Eden, November 1891.

November 23, 1891.

E. G. Mason and Stephen Smallidge, Selectmen of Mt. Desert and C. F. Paine, E. S. Clark and Alonzo Higgins Selectmen of Eden, and myself met, according to previous arrangement, at Otter Creek and proceeded to perambulate the line between said towns as follows: to wit: -

We commenced at a large rock, marked "B" at the head of Otter Creek; thence ran North 43° and 30' west to a Birch Tree, spotted, standing on the west side of the Brook and on the West side of the Bridge at the "Head of the Doctor's Creek" (so called). We respootted this line. There are bounds on this line as follows: - An Iron Bolt set in a large Rock on the western side of the County road at Otter Creek, five or six Iron Bolts set in ledges on Green Mountain, a Stone Bound on the Western side of an old sled road in Turtle Lake Valley, two Iron Bolts set in the ledge on Penetic, two Iron Bolts set in ledges on the Northern slope of Sargents Mountain, a Stake and pile of stones on the Northern spur of said Mountain, and a stone bound set in the ground on the Western side of the County Road leading from the Sound to Bar Harbor.

December 2, 1891 E. G. Mason & L. H. Somes Selectmen of Mt. Desert and C. F. Paine and Alonzo Higgins Selectmen of Eden, W. W. Higgins and myself began at the "Birch Tree" near the bridge at the "Head of the Doctor's Creek" and ran North 78° West to the shore at Leigh Head. This line from the "Birch" is spotted new (not following the old spots.) On the east side of the town road, near Oak Hill there is a large stone bound set in the ground thence it follows line fences & spotted trees to a stone Bound set in the ground on the east side of the County road, leading from Indian Point to Tully, marks thence by stakes to a stake and pile of stones at the top of the bank at High Head
