Greeting:

You are hereby required, in the name of the State of Maine, to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Eden, qualified according to the Constitution and the laws of this State to assemble at Music Hall, Bar Harbor in said town on Monday the twelfth day of September A.D. 1892 at eight o'clock in the forenoon, to give in their votes for Governor,

1. - Shall the Constitution of the State be amended as proposed by Resoln of the Legislature, <sup>February</sup> March 31, A.D. 1891 -
2. - Shall the Constitution of the State be amended as proposed by resolve approved April 3, A.D. 1891 -

Amendment 1.

The Adjutant General and Quarter-Master General shall be appointed by the Governor.

Shall the Constitution be amended as proposed by Resolution of the Legislature providing that the Adjutant General and Quarter-Master General shall be appointed by the Governor? \_\_\_\_\_

Amendment 2.

No Person shall have the right to vote or be eligible to office under the Constitution of this State who shall not be able to read the Constitution in the English Language,

and to write his name. Provided however that the provisions of this Amendment shall not apply to any person prevented by physical disability from complying with its requisitions, nor to any person who now has the right to vote nor to any person who shall be sixty years of age, or upwards at the time this Amendment shall take effect.

Shall the Constitution be so amended as to change the qualification of voters as proposed in said resolve?

Those in favor of said Amendments will vote Yes.  
And those opposed No upon their ballots.

The Polls will close at five o'clock P.M.

Woe of fail not, and have you there this Warrant with you bring them on.

The Selectmen will be in session at Engine House Hall Bar Harbor in said town on the 8th, 9th + 10th days of September being the three secular days next preceding the day of Election from 8 o'clock in the forenoon till 5 o'clock in the afternoon of each day for the purpose of hearing and deciding upon the applications of those claiming the right to vote in said town and that no names will be received later than 5 o'clock in the afternoon on the secular day next preceding the day of Election and that no names will be received on the day of Election except such as were upon the list of the previous year and have been inadvertently omitted by the Selectmen.
