Bar Harbor, July 8, 1893.

We the undersigned Selectmen of the Town of Eden, do hereby divide said town into the following fire districts.

Beginning on the Town line on the shore at Leigh Head, thence following the shore northerly + easterly to North East Creek, so called, thence following the shore northerly, + easterly to North East Creek. - thence following said creek to the town road at the Beaver Dam Bridge near R. H. James, thence following the road south to J. H. Emery's thence on a straight line to the County road near Sones Sound where said town line crosses said road, thence following said line westerly to the point of beginning, to be called District No. 1. - and have assigned the care and oversight of said District to Alonzo Higgins as Fire Warden.

District No. 2. Is described as follows: -

Beginning at the mouth of N. E. Creek, thence following the shore easterly to Saul's Creek so called, thence following the said creek or brook to Eden St. thence following said Eden St. to its junction with Eagle Lake Road, thence following said Eagle Lake Road to Eagle Lake Stream, thence following said stream to the Lake, thence by the eastern shore of said Lake and on a straight line to Bottle Pond thence by said line to District No. 1 and have assigned the care and oversight of said No. 2 to Chas. F. James as Fire Warden.

District No. 3. Is described as follows: -

Beginning at the mouth of Saul's Creek so-called, thence following the shore easterly + southerly to the town line at Otter Creek, thence following said town line to District No. 2. - and have assigned the care and oversight of said District to J. E. Whitmore as Fire Warden.

George W. Vanderbilt's Wharf,
at Bar Harbor, Eden, Maine.

To Charles F. Paine, Alonzo Higgins and Frank E. Whitmore, Municipal Officers of the town of Eden, Hancock County, State of Maine:—

I, George W. Vanderbilt, of the City, County and State of New York, owner of real estate in said ^{town of} Eden, intending to build a wharf in tide waters within the limits of said town of Eden, hereby respectfully make application to you in writing to grant a license therefor.

The location, limits and boundaries of such intended wharf are as follows, to wit:— Said location is entirely upon and in front of land owned by me the said Vanderbilt and is described as follows:— Beginning at an iron bolt in the ledge near high water mark on the South shore of Cromwell's Harbor, so called, which said bolt bears North Seventy-nine degrees East and is distant two hundred and fifty-four feet from another iron bolt set in the ledge also near high water mark; thence from said first named iron bolt Westward but following the line of high water mark two hundred and fifty-four feet more or less to the iron bolt second above specified; thence North sixteen degrees ten minutes West two hundred thirty-five feet; thence North forty seven degrees two minutes East two hundred eighteen and twenty five one hundredths feet to a point bearing North eleven degrees West and one hundred and eighty one feet distant from a large boulder on the shore near low water mark; thence North eighty five degrees fifty two minutes East three hundred seven and forty three one hundredths feet to a point bearing North twenty three degrees thirty minutes East and distant three hundred and eighty feet from the iron bolt at the point of beginning; thence South twenty three degrees thirty minutes West two hundred and eighty feet to an iron bolt in the ledge near low water mark, thence on same course 120 ft. to the iron bolt at the point of beginning.

(3) Whereas application in writing has been made to the undersigned, Municipal Officers, of the town of Eden - Hancock County Maine by George W. Vanderbilt, a property owner in said town of Eden setting forth that he intends to build a wharf in tide waters within the limits of said town of Eden and stating the location, limits and boundaries of such intended erection and asking license therefor.

We gave public notice of said application by causing notices to be posted in three public places in said town to wit: - One at the Selectmens Office; - one at the Post Office at Bar Harbor and one on George W. Vanderbilts premises in each notice designating a day on which we should meet on or near the premises described and examine the same: all said notices were posted on May 27th - being at least three days before the time appointed.

The above is a true copy of said application and notice which copies are expressly referred to and made a part of this license.

In pursuance of said application and said notices we met in said Town of Eden on the premises described

on the first day of June A.D. 1893 at ten o'clock in the forenoon being the ^{time} designated and thence proceeded to view and examine the location, limits and boundaries of said intended wharf as set forth and described in said application immediately after which examination and view a hearing of all persons and witnesses was held at Engine House Hall Bar Harbor in said Town of Eden.

After making such examination and hearing the Justice and witnesses fully and fully understanding the matter we have decided and do decide that the erection of a wharf or wharves within the limits hereinafter described would not be an obstruction to navigation or an injury to the rights of others - and we have determined to allow the same.

Therefore the said George W. Vanderbilt is licensed and authorized to erect and maintain a wharf or wharves in tide waters in said Town of Eden within the limits hereinafter described being also within the limits described in said application, to wit:—

Beginning at an iron bolt set in the ledge at high water mark on said Vanderbilts shore on the Southern side of Comrellis Harbor so called - thence North twenty three degrees thirty minutes East one hundred twenty feet to an iron bolt set in the ledge near low water mark. thence on same course two hundred and sixty feet: thence South eighty five degrees fifty two minutes West one hundred eighty feet more or less to a point bearing North twenty three degrees thirty minutes East from an iron bolt in a large boulder on the shore near low water mark: thence South twenty three degrees thirty minutes West two hundred ten feet more or less to said iron bolt in said boulder: thence South eleven degrees East, one hundred and eighty feet more or less to an iron bolt in a rock near high water mark: thence by the line of high water mark Easterly to the place of beginning.
