Collectors Return.

To Samuel N. Rich, Clerk of the town of Eden, in the County of Hancock, and State of Maine.

Pursuant to the provisions of law, I caused the taxes assessed on the real estate of resident owners, or proprietors in the said town of Eden, for the year 1893, and that remained unpaid for the term of nine months from the date of the assessment, and in the list of assessments by the Assessors of said town, committed to me on the twenty-third day of June 1893, together with a warrant under their hands for the collection of the same in the form by law prescribed, and said taxes remaining unpaid as aforesaid, and whereas no person appeared to discharge the same, although after the expiration of said term of nine months, to wit: on the sixth day of May, A. The Bar Harbor Water Company hereby gives public notice that by authority of its Directors and under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by its act of incorporation to wit: Private and Special Act of the Legislature of the State of Maine for the year 1874, Numbered 449. and approved February 10, 1874 and Acts amendatory thereof and additional thereto, it has taken and purposes to take and hold for the purpose of erecting and maintaining a dam or dams and a reservoir or reservoirs and other fixtures connected therewith authorized by its said Act of Incorporation: A certain lot or parcel of land situated adjacent to Eagle Lake, in the town of Eden, Hancock County, Maine, bounded and described as follows, to wit: -
Beginning at a stone post marked "B." set in the ground bearing North sixty-one degrees and fifty six minutes West and distant two hundred twenty seven and five tenths feet from the twenty-four inch valve on the twenty-four inch pipe of the Bar Harbor Water Company: said stone post also bears North forty degrees east and is one hundred and twenty-eight feet distant from an iron bolt set in the ledge, at or near the shore of Eagle Lake: thence from said stone post running South fifty degrees east four hundred and eighteen feet, crossing Duck Brook to another stone post marked "B." set in the ground; thence South, forty degrees West, eighty-eight feet
