NOTICE.

In conformity with the provisions of Sections Seventy-six and Seventy-seven of Chapter one hundred and four of the public laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five, upon the petition of five or more citizens of the State, and deeming it for the best interest of the State, the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game, after due notice to all persons interested in the subject matter of said petition, and public hearing thereon in the locality to be affected, and deeming it necessary and proper for the protection and preservation of the ~~game fish~~ of the State, hereby adopt the following needful Rules and Regulations relating to the times and places in which and the circumstances under which ~~fish~~ ^{deer} may be taken in the ~~waters of~~ towns of Eden, Mount Desert and Tremont in the County of Hancock, State of Maine.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

The killing, hunting, destroying, taking or having in possession, any deer or parts thereof for a period of four (4) years from October first, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, is hereby absolutely prohibited within the following described territory, that is to say, within the limits of the towns of Eden, Mount Desert and Tremont, in the County of Hancock. Whoever shall kill, hunt for, take, destroy or have in possession, any deer or parts thereof, within the above described towns, during said time, taken from said territory, shall be punished according to the provisions of the law in this behalf made and provided.

Sec. 82, Chap 104 Public Laws of 1895: Any person who willfully mutilates, defaces or destroys any notice, rule or regulation of the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, posted in conformity with the provisions of this act, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars, to be recovered by complaint or indictment; one half of said fine shall be paid to the prosecutor.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Fishing for, taking, catching, killing or destroying in any manner, any land-locked salmon, or trout, is hereby absolutely prohibited, for and during a term of four years from July fifteenth, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, in Eagle Lake in the town of Eden in the County of Hancock. It shall be unlawful to have in possession any of the above named fish, or parts thereof, taken during said time, from the waters of said Eagle Lake. Whoever shall violate any of the above named provisions, rules and regulations, shall be punished according to the provisions of the law made and provided.
