Public Act of the Legislature of the State of Maine, for the year 1874, numbered 449, and approved February 10, 1874, and acts amendatory thereof and additional thereto, and for the purposes set forth in said Act and amendments and additions it has taken and purposes to take, detain and use the water of Duck Brook, being same, brook mentioned in said Act of Incorporation; that it has caused surveys to be made for the purpose of locating its dams, reservoirs, pipes and other fixtures and has caused an accurate plan of such location entitled

"Profile and Plan showing the taking of the water of Eagle Lake and Duck Brook by the Bar Harbor Water Company" to be filed in the office of the Town Clerk, of the town of Eden, Hancock County, Maine.

The quantity of water taken may be determined by the outlet pipe shown upon said profile and plan through which pipe alone water is to be taken.

Said pipe is described generally as follows; to wit: - Pipe twenty-four inches in diameter starting from a gate house in Eagle Lake, near the head of Duck Brook and running about fifteen hundred and fifty-five feet to the stand pipe, where the size of the outlet pipe is diminished to sixteen inches in diameter.

The junction of the twenty-four inch and sixteen inch pipe is at a point fourteen and five tenths feet below the level of Eagle Lake.

All persons will govern themselves accordingly.
