thence deflecting to its tangent and running south seventy-two (72) degrees and twenty-eight minutes east one hundred and eighty feet to another stone monument which bears south seventeen degrees and thirty-two minutes west and is thirty-three feet distant from another stone monument which marks the north east side of said strip; thence deflecting to the right on a regular curve whose radius is three hundred and eighty-five feet and angle of intersection is sixty degrees and forty minutes to its point of tangency at a stone monument in the western line of Bloomfield Road, so-called, as it is now built, and which bears south seventy-eight degrees and twelve minutes west from another stone monument in the eastern line of said Bloomfield Road, and is thirty-three feet distant therefrom.

Said strip so taken and condemned crosses land of M. C. Haigh, land formerly of S. E. Lyon, land of Pickie, heirs of Mary A. Salisbury and land of Charles J. How, or of persons unknown, and is fifty feet in width from the starting point to the point described in land of heirs of Mary A. Salisbury, and is thirty-three feet wide from that point to its junction with Bloomfield Road on the property of Charles J. How.
