Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are
hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants

Article 22. To see if the town will accept a sewer as laid out by the Selectmen, beginning at How's Park at that portion of Cleftstone Road near the Matthews cottage and ending at the present sewer near Central Avenue, so called.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to reconstruct the sewer on Mt. Desert and Main streets to Wayman Lane.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to construct a sewer on Bridge street in accordance with the Bowditch system.

Article 25. To see if the town will accept a town way as laid out by the Selectmen following the existing private way known as Ash Street from Second South street to Cromwell Harbor road.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to Macadamize Main Street between Cottage and West streets and build permanent sidewalks on either side.

Article 27. To fix compensation of Superintendent of Schools and Superintending School Committee.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote and instruct the Selectmen to receive bids for sprinkling streets with the right to reject any or all bids.

Article 29. To see if the town will vote that the Chief Engineer of the Fire Department shall have the expending of the money raised for Fire Department.

Article 30. To see if the town will vote how the taxes shall be collected for the ensuing year.

Article 31. To see if the town will vote what discount shall be allowed on taxes and for what time.

Article 32. To fix compensation of Treasurer and Collector.

Article 33. To see if the town will vote to build an extension to the school building on School street.

Article 34. To see if the town will vote to have a telephone placed in the engine house.

Article 35. To see if the town will vote to have a competent man employed at the engine house constantly.

Article 36. To see if the ~~town~~ town will accept a list of jurors as prepared by the Selectmen.

Article 46. To raise money to pay interest on notes and debts.

Article 47. To raise money for support of poor.

Article 48. To raise money for common schools.

Article 49. To raise money to repair school property.

Article 51. To raise money to build extension to school building mentioned in Article 33.

Article 69. To see if the town raise a sum of money to defray the expense of receiving and entertaining the yacht club or for any other purpose and appoint a committee under whose direction the money so raised may be expended.

Article 70. To see if the town will raise a sum of money for a series of open air band concerts during the summer season.

Article 72. To see if the town will raise two hundred dollars and put it in the hands of the Trustees of the Eden Farmers club to be expended by them in encouraging the agricultural interests of the town.

Article 75. To see if the town will raise a sum of money to purchase and distribute copies of the illustrated souvenir edition of the Bar Harbor Record through the western cities.

Article 76. To see if the town will vote to have the street lights hang over the center of the streets.
