Proceeding of Special Town Meeting held May 19, 1898.
 State of Maine Hancock Co.

In accordance with the foregoing Warrant duly posted and published the legal voters of the town of Eden met at the time and place designated in said Warrant viz. May 19, 1898 at ten o'clock P.M. at Police Station Hall Bar Harbor and proceeded to act on the various articles as follows to wit:—

Article 1. Voted That B. E. Whitney be Moderator and he was duly sworn by Town Clerk.

Article 2. Voted That the town hire the sum of eighteen thousand (\$18,000) dollars and that the selectmen be authorized to issue negotiable notes for said sum; ten thousand dollars payable in three months and eight thousand dollars payable in four months bearing interest at not more than six per centum per annum.

Article 3. Voted That the Treasurer and Collector be authorized to place in the hands of an officer for collection such poll taxes and personal property taxes of 1898 as are liable to be lost by removal from town of persons owing such taxes when in his judgment it seems advisable.

Voted to adjourn until one week from date to meet at this place at ten o'clock P.M. Met according to adjournment May 26, 1898 and proceeded to act on

Article 4. Voted That the town ratify a certain deed given by the Municipal Officer to Martha Higgins.
