Report of above town way-
(Des Isle Avenue to School Street-)

The Subscribers, Selectmen of Eden upon the application of William Clark and

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seventeen others, inhabitants of said Eden, to lay out a town way in said town, for the use of said town, described as follows, to-wit:-

beginning in the center of the private way known as Des Isle Avance on the northern side of First South Street in Bar Harbor in said Eden, thence following the center line of said private way known as Des Isle Avance northerly to the southern line of land of Benj. Kittredge, thence on the same course northerly across land of said Kittredge to the southern side of the town way leading from Main Street past Hotel Des Isle to School Street, and having given seven days notice of our intention to lay out the same and stated in said notice the terminus of said way by posting said notice in two places in said town and in the vicinity of the proposed route, to-wit:-

One in the Selectmen's Office and one in the Post Office at Bar Harbor in said town, and having met at the time and place appointed for that purpose and having personally examined the route proposed, are of the opinion that there is occasion for a new town way for the use of said town, we therefore lay out said way as follows.

Beginning at a point in the north line of South Street one hundred and two and four tenths feet easterly from a stone post which marks the junction of the north line of said South Street and the east line of School Street, thence north two degrees and fifty minutes east along the west line of said Des Isle Avance three hundred nineteen and six tenths feet to a Cedar post, at the south-west corner of land of Benj. Kittredge, also the south-east corner of land of W. H. Davis, thence on the same course to-wit:- north two degrees and fifty minutes east following the west line of said land of said Kittredge one hundred and twenty-four and six tenths feet to a piece of iron pipe driven in the ground in the south line of a town way leading from Main Street to School Street,

Said iron pipe marking the said north-east corner of said land of said Kittredge, the above described line being the western line of the way and the eastern line thereof shall be parallel with and everywhere twenty feet distant from the above described line, the way passes over a right of way twenty feet wide and over the land of said Benj. Kittredge. We have awarded damages to the said Benj. Kittredge in the sum of thirteen hundred and forty dollars to be paid by said town of Eden.

Such laying out with the boundaries and measurements has been filed with the town clerk on the twenty-fifth day of February A.D. 1899, being seven days before this meeting and we hereby report such laying out with the boundaries and measurements of the way to said town regularly named and notified for them to accept and allow the same.
