To W. H. Sherman Clerk of the Town of Eden -
 in the County of Hancock and State of Maine.
 Pursuant to law I caused the taxes assessed

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you
 are hereby required to notify and warn
 the inhabitants of the Town of Eden, qualified
 by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at
 Music Hall, Bar Harbor, in said Town
 on Monday, the fifth day of March A.D.
 1900 at ten o'clock A.M. to act on the
 following articles, to wit:-

Article 1:- To choose a Moderator to preside
 at said meeting.

Article 2:- To choose a Town Clerk for the
 ensuing year.

Article 3:- To hear report of Town Officers and
 Committees and to act thereon.

Article 4:- To choose Selectmen and Assessors
 for the ensuing year.

Article 5:- To choose a Town Treasurer for the
 ensuing year.

Article 6:- To choose an Overseer or Overseers of
 the poor.

Article 7:- To choose a Road Commissioner or
 Commissioners.

Article 8:- To choose a member of the Superintending School Committee.

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Article 9: To see if the Town will vote to choose
a Superintendent of Schools

Article 10: To see if the Town will ^{fix} compensation of
Superintendent of Schools for ensuing year.

Article 11: To see if the town will fix compensation
of Superintending School Committee.

Article 12: To choose Constables.

Article 13: To choose Fence Viewers.

Article 14: To choose Pound Keepers.

Article 15: To choose Surveyors of Lumber and Measures
of bark and wood.

Article 16: To choose Reighers of Hay and grain.

Article 17: To choose an Agent of Town School Fund.

Article 18: To choose Fish and Game Wardens.

Article 19: To choose Fire Wardens.

Article 20: To choose a Tinent Officer or Tuant Officer.

Article 21: To choose a collector of Taxes.

Article 22: To choose a Chief of Fire Department.

Article 23: To choose all other necessary Town Officers.

Article 24: To see if the Town will vote how the taxes
shall be collected for the ensuing year.

Article 25: To see if the Town will vote what amount

shall be allowed on paper and for that time.

Article 27: - To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to receive bids for sprinkling streets with the right to reject any or all bids.

Article 28: - To see if the town will vote to have a competent man employed at the Engine House constantly.

Article 29: - To raise money to defray town charges.

Article 30: - To raise money to pay principal on town notes.

Article 31: - To raise money to pay interest on notes and orders.

Article 32: - To raise money for support of Poor.

Article 33: - To raise money for Common schools.

Article 34: - To raise money to repair school property.

Article 35: - To raise money for Free High Schools.

Article 36: - To see if the town will raise a sum of money for support of Public library.

Article 37: - To raise money for text books and receptacles.

Article 38: - To raise money for repairing roads and bridges.

Article 39: - To raise money to construct and repair sidewalks at Bar Harbor.

Article 40:- To raise money for support of
Fire Department.

Article 41:- To raise money to construct and repair sewers.

Article 42:- To raise money to dispose of garbage.

Article 43:- To raise money to light streets.

Article 44:- To raise money to sprinkle streets.

Article 45:- To raise money to clean streets.

Article 46:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money to help defray the expenses of Memorial Day.

Article 47:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money to construct and repair sidewalks at Hulls Cove.

Article 48:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money to repair sidewalks at Salisbury Cove.

Article 49:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money to construct and repair sidewalks at Thomas District.

Article 50:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money to support the town team.

Article 51:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money to pay for services of health officers.

Article 52:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money for a series of open air band concerts during the summer season.

Article 53:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money

To grade the Grand Central lot.

Article 54:- To see if the town will raise one hundred dollars and put it in the hands of the Trustees of the Eden Agricultural Society to be expended by them in encouraging the agricultural interest of the town.

Article 55:- To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to assist in maintaining the Bas Harbor Medical and Surgical Hospital.

Article 56:- To see if the town will vote to purchase one thousand feet of fire hose and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 57:- To see what action the town will take in regard to draining Cottage Street near Bridge Street and Maple Avenue.

Article 58:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money to grade and drain that part of West Street between Bridge Street and Holland Avenue.

Article 59:- To see what action the town will take in regard to draining Bridge Street.

Article 60:- To see if the town will vote to enter into a contract for a term of years with the Bas Harbor Water Company for a supply of water for the extinguishment of fires and other municipal purposes. And to authorize the board of selectmen, or a committee to agree upon the terms of such contract and to execute the same. And further to authorize the board of selectmen or such committee to agree upon the

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compensation to be paid for water so furnished, or to submit the amount of such compensation to arbitration.

Article 61:- To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to locate additional hydrants in Bar Harbor, as follows, one on Forest Street, one at the corner of Holland Avenue and West Street, one at the corner of Bridge Street and West Street, one on Hancock Street, one near the Ketterbims cottage, one near Mrs Piddles cottage on Eagle Lake Road, one near Keds Valley grounds and also other additional hydrants.

Article 62:- To raise money to Jay Bar Harbor Water Company for use of water for fire and municipal purposes for ensuing year.

Article 63:- To see if the town will locate additional lights near Keds Valley Club.

Article 64:- To see if the town will construct a sidewalk on Forest Street and raise money for same.

Article 65:- To see what action the town will take in regard to selling so much of the Grand Central Lot "so called" as is situated between the grave yard lot and an extension of the north line of the Kitteridge lot.

Article 66:- To see if the town will vote to exempt the Y. M. C. A. property from taxation.

Article 67:- To see if the town will vote to relieve the sewer on lower Main Street Bar Harbor, by constructing a drain for surface water from the vicinity of South Street to the lower falls Harbor brook and to raise money for the purpose.

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Article 68:- To see if the town will vote to rebuild the Main Street bridge over the Comralls Harbor brook and to improve the road from said bridge to the junction of Main Street with the Strawberry Hill road and to raise money for such purpose.

Article 69:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money to widen and straighten the Comralls Harbor brook to prevent the overflowing of the road in times of freshet.

Article 70:- To see if the town will vote to provide an adequate sewer system for First and Second South Streets and lower Main Street and raise money for same.

Article 71:- To see if the town will vote to light the street between Dan Harbor and Hills Cove.

Article 72:- To see what action the town will take in regard to having a survey and plans made of the streets and roads of the town.

Article 73:- To see if the town will vote and raise money to construct so much of the new County road leading from Dan Harbor to Seal Harbor near the Village of Otter Creek recently laid out by the County Commissioners as lies within the limits of the town of Eden.

Article 74:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money to purchase rubber coats and hats for the Fire Company.

Article 75:- To see if the town will adopt an ordinance relating to the construction.

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maintenance and inspection of buildings in the village of Bar Harbor.

Article 76:- To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to name the streets in the village of Bar Harbor; to place sign boards at the corners of same and to number the houses on said streets and raise a sum of money for that purpose.

Article 77:- To see if the town will vote to move and repair the Grand Central stable and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 78:- To see if the town will vote to instruct the Road Commissioner to repair the road leading from the town way to land of Eben Burns and Burned Gilbert in the Knot District.

Article 79:- To see what action the town will take relative to the town's horses.

Article 80:- To see if the town will vote to construct a fire alarm system in Bar Harbor and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 81:- To see if the town will raise a sum of money to defray the land damage on a town way as laid out by the selectmen leading from Sipes farm to Aunt Betsey's brook.

Article 82:- To see if the town will provide a sewer for Seth Hopkins, C. H. Young and others on a private way leading along Eddy brook.

Article 83:- To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to locate an additional arc light on lower Main Street.

Article 84:- To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to pay land damage and to build a town way as laid out by the selectmen, and accepted by the town at its annual meeting held in March A.D. 1899. beginning at a point where Des Isle Avenue intersects First South Street thence running northerly over said Des Isle Avenue and land of Benjamin Kettleidge to a town way leading from Main Street to School Street.

Article 85:- To see if the town will vote to accept a sewer as laid out by the selectmen, beginning at a man hole in the Forest Street branch where said branch crosses Eagle Lake road. thence running in a general south westerly direction along said Eagle Lake road one thousand five hundred and twenty five (1525) feet to a point opposite the Kew Valley Club house, and raise a sum of money to construct the same.

86:- To see if the town will vote to accept a sewer as laid out by the selectmen, beginning at Eden Street at the junction of Myrtle Avenue, thence easterly along Myrtle Avenue to Maple Avenue and raise a sum of money to construct the same.

Article 87:- To see if the town will vote to accept the alteration of the town way as laid out by the selectmen running in a southeasterly direction from the southern terminus of the Harden Farm road - so-called to the Otter Creek road opposite Robin Hood Park.

Article 88:- To see if the town will vote to accept a town way as laid out by the Selectmen beginning at a point in the town way near the north line of land of G. H. Richards. thence running easterly to land of Hannah Richards.

Article 89:- To see if the town will vote to accept a town way as laid out by the selectmen beginning at a point in Mt. Desert street near the east line of the Kitteridge lot thence running northerly to land of F. and J. H. Rodick thence westerly to the Episcopal Church lot thence northerly to the southern end of Kemekee Place.

Article 90:- To see if the town will vote to accept a town way as laid out by the selectmen beginning at a point in Ledge Lawn Avenue thence running in a westerly direction to Spring Street.

Article 91:- To see if the town will vote to accept a town way as laid out by the selectmen beginning at a point in Ledge Lawn Avenue, thence running in a westerly direction to Glen Mary road.

Article 92:- To see if the town will vote to accept a town way as laid out by the selectmen beginning at a point in Cromwells Harbor road thence running northerly to the Waldron road.

Article 93:- To see if the town will vote to accept a town way as laid out by the selectmen, beginning at a point in Mount Desert Street near the west line of land of Mary Shannon, thence in a southerly direction to Cromwells Harbor road.
