This Indenture made and entered into this twenty second day of September, A.D. 1906, by and between the inhabitants of the town of Eden, a Municipal Corporation in Hancock County, State of Maine, party of the first part, and John S. Kennedy of the City, County and State of New York, party of the second part.

Witness:-

That Whereas said Municipal Corporation has built and now maintains a drain through land of said Kennedy at Bar Harbor, in said Eden, extending from Main Street to a point near the mouth of Comwells Harbor Brook, and

Whereas said drain having been built and maintained by said Municipal Corporation without condemnation of the land, and without any deed or writing from the land owner, a controversy has arisen as to whether the municipal Corporation has a right to maintain such drain, and if such right exists by dedication or otherwise as to the extent and limits of such rights, and

Whereas a suit is now pending in the United States Circuit Court for the District of Maine, brought by said Kennedy the purpose of settling such controversy, and establishing the relative rights of the parties hereto, and

Whereas the parties hereto have agreed and do hereby agree to settle said controversy and suit; said Kennedy on his part agreeing to establish and confirm said Municipal Corporation's rights to maintain said drain, and not for sewage; and said Municipal Corporation on its part agreeing to release any and all rights not necessary for the maintenance and repair of said drain to be used for surface water only, and

Whereas this instrument is made and executed for the purpose of carrying such agreement into full effect. Now known all men by these presents that the said John S. Kennedy does hereby grant unto said Municipal Corporation the perpetual right - and does hereby establish and confirm any existing rights of

said Corporation if any, to maintain and repair such drain for surface drainage purposes only; - but all rights granted, established and confirmed hereby shall be and are limited to a strip of land through which said pipe is laid, extending from said Main Street to the mouth of said drain as now constructed, said strip of land to be eight feet in width, one half on each side of the center of said drain as now constructed.

And said Municipal Corporation by its Selectmen thereto duly authorized, consenting, and its said Selectmen consenting the rights herein released as unnecessary for the purposes of this Town, does hereby release to said Kennedy, his heirs and assigns any and all rights in connection with said drain in and to any land or property of said Kennedy outside of the strip of land eight feet in width - above prescribed, and does hereby also release to said Kennedy, his heirs and assigns any and all rights that it may have in any manner acquired to use the surface of said strip of land eight feet in width for any purpose except the maintenance of manholes and except such use as may be necessary for the repair of such drain and does hereby further release to said Kennedy, his heirs and assigns, all rights if any, that it may have in any manner acquired to use said drain for sewage purposes.

Said Municipal Corporation by its Selectmen further stipulates and agrees that it has no right to use said drain for the carrying of sewage; that it will not disturb the surface of the ground except when necessary to repair said drain; that when the surface of the ground is disturbed for the above purpose, such surface shall as soon as may be, be restored to its former condition; that said Kennedy, his heirs and assigns shall have the perpetual right to enter said drain in a reasonable and proper manner, and to use the same for surface drainage.
