

Adoption of By Laws By The Local Board of Health  
of The Town of Eden.

Meeting of the Local Board of Health of the Town of Eden,  
Hancock County, State of Maine, held at the Town Office  
in Eden, Town of Eden, aforesaid on Thursday May 21<sup>st</sup>,  
1908 at ten o'clock in the forenoon.

Present: Daniel G. Hall, J. Alden Morse and  
Charles Madden, being the entire Local Board of Health.

On motion it was unanimously voted to  
make and adopt for said Town of Eden, the By Laws  
hereinafter set forth in Articles numbered from 1 to 16  
inclusive.

On motion it was unanimously resolved by  
such Board that such By Laws are necessary and  
proper for the preservation of life and health and  
the successful operation of the health laws of the State.

Relating To Plumbing.

Article 1:- Every Plumber doing any work in a  
building shall, except in the repair of leaks, file at  
the office of the board of health, or its agent, upon  
plumbing for that purpose, a notice of the work to be  
performed and no such work shall be done in any  
building without the approval of said board or its  
agent.

Article 2:- The plumbing of every building shall  
be separately and independently connected with  
the public sewer, when such sewer is provided,  
or with a proper drain connected thereto outside  
of the building, or, if sewer is not accessible,  
with a proper cesspool.

Article 3:- Pipes and other fixtures shall not  
be covered or concealed from view until approved  
by the board of health or its agents.

Article 4:- Plumbing work shall not be used  
unless the same has been listed in the presence  
of a member of the board of health or its agent.  
Water shall be used for said list where  
practicable. If not practicable peppermint or  
some other reliable list may be made and  
approved by him in writing.

Article 5:- Drain pipes shall be of sufficient size and made of Cast iron within the building and for a distance of at least ten feet outside. Drain pipes shall be carried above the roof open and unobstructed in size, and not less than five feet above the top of any window within fifteen feet.

Article 6:- Rain Water Conductors when connected with soil or drain pipes shall be suitably trapped.

Article 7:- Joints of Cast-iron pipes shall be made by thoroughly calking the same with molten lead, joints of lead pipes with iron pipes shall be made by soldering the same into brass ferrules and calking the ferrules into Cast iron pipes or throwing them to wrought iron pipes.

The waste pipe of each and every fixture shall be furnished with a suitable trap which shall be placed as near as practicable to the fixture that it serves.

Article 8:- Every person doing any Plumbing work in, upon or in connection with any building in the Town of Eden, shall do his work in conformity to the provisions of the several Articles next preceding.

### Relating to Production and Sale of Milk in the Town of Eden.

Article 9:- No person shall engage in the business of selling milk in the Town of Eden without obtaining and having in full force a license as hereinafter provided.

Article 10:- No person shall engage in the sale of milk in the town of Eden, except under proper sanitary conditions and the sale of milk shall not be considered as under proper sanitary conditions unless conforming to the regulations hereinafter set forth.

Article 11:- Upon application made by any person desiring to engage in the sale of milk in the town of Eden, the Local Board of Health or the Milk Inspector appointed by such Board shall make inspection of the farms, animals, water and food supplies and also the farms, animals, water and food supplies of all persons from whom such applicant may obtain milk intended for sale and also the equipment of such applicant for collecting and distributing milk. And having made such inspection may grant a license to such applicant, authorizing him to engage in the sale of milk in said town, upon becoming satisfied that any license is not observing proper sanitary conditions in the production or sale of milk the Local Board of Health may revoke such license.

Article 12:- The Local Board of Health or Milk Inspector shall make at least two inspections annually and in making such inspection shall examine into the ventilation and light of barns and stables, health and cleanliness of animals, condition of apparatus for collecting and distributing milk, situations of water supply, variety and quality of food, cleanliness of attendants and shall find the specific gravity of milk, subjecting it to the Babcock test.

Article 13:- Any change in the source of milk supply shall be reported to the milk Inspector or Local Board of Health within five days.

Article 14:- Barns shall be kept clean and well ventilated, the water supply pure and well situated and food of good quality, animals shall be kept clean and attendants shall observe cleanliness in person. Milk shall be strained, stored and kept in a clean place. Vehicles used in vending milk shall have the owners name and license number painted on each side.

Article 15:- Milk shall be strained through not less than five thicknesses of suitable cloth or its equivalent.

Article 16:- A fee of fifty cents shall be paid to the town by each licensee. Should the board find that any person has failed to comply with the requirements of this by laws such person may be required to pay the expense of inspection and in case of failure to pay such expense the board may revoke the license granted to such person.

The Bar Harbor and Union River Power Company

Bar Harbor and Union River Power Company.

Whereas the Bar Harbor and Union River Power Company, a corporation established and existing under the laws of the State of Maine, and doing business in said State of Maine, by its petition filed with the Selectmen of the Town of Eden, Hancock County, State of Maine, on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of May A. D. 1908, made an application to the Selectmen of said town for a written permit to construct and maintain lines of poles and wires for the transmission of electric light and power, and also to construct and maintain necessary supporting and strengthening fixtures within and along certain highways and townways in said Town of Eden, being some highways and townways hereinafter described, and

Whereas upon said application fourteen days public notice thereof was ordered to be given, by publishing a copy of said petition and notice in the Bar Harbor Record, a newspaper printed at Bar Harbor in said Town of Eden, two weeks successively, the last publication to be fourteen days at least prior to the date of meeting for the granting of such permit, a true copy of such petition and order of notice is prefixed hereto and made a part of this permit, and

Whereas we, the undersigned, Selectmen of the Town of Eden, met at the time and place specified in said notice, to wit, at the office of the Selectmen at Bar Harbor, in said town on Thursday, the 18<sup>th</sup> day of June A. D. 1908, at nine o'clock in the forenoon. At said meeting before proceeding with the hearing, the Bar Harbor and Union River Power Company first proved that such order of notice had been complied with, and that public notice had been given as required thereby, to wit, that a true copy of said petition and notice had been published in the Bar Harbor Record, a newspaper printed at Bar Harbor in said town, two weeks successively, to wit, on May 27<sup>th</sup> and June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1908, the last publication having been fourteen days prior to the date of said meeting. We therefore find and adjudicate that the public notice ordered by us has been given, and

Whereas after proving such notice, we heard the



company through its attorney and agents and all persons in opposition, and immediately afterwards proceeded to view the proposed route, and after hearing and fully understanding said matter we determined to grant a written permit to said corporation as provided by section 17, of Chapter 55, R.S.

Now therefore, having given fourteen days notice as aforesaid, and having given residents and owners of property upon the highways and townways to be affected, full opportunity to show cause why such permit should not be granted, we have determined and adjudicated to give, and do hereby give to said Bar Harbor and Union River Power Company for the purpose of carrying out its objects, written permit to construct and maintain lines of poles and wires for the transmission of electric light and power, and also to construct and maintain necessary supporting and strengthening fixtures within and along the following highways and townways in said Town of Eden, to wit:

Beginning at the junction of the Hardew Road with the Cromwell Harbor Road and thence running southerly and Easterly following said Hardew Road to the junction of said Hardew Road with the extension of Ledgebrook Avenue. Also at the corner of Edgewood Street and Main Street.

The posts shall be of cedar, chestnut or other suitable wood, or of metal, reasonably straight, set securely in or upon the surface of the ground and projecting not less than twenty-five feet above the ground; the posts, together with necessary supporting and strengthening fixtures may be located within the limits of any and all the highways and townways, and the wires may cross from one side to the other of said highways and townways wherever said company may desire, and the wires may be run from pole to pole upon, along and across said highways and townways at a height of at least twenty feet above the ground.

And as incidental to the rights and powers hereby granted and permitted, said company may do any and all things necessary to enable it to fully carry out its purposes in the manner above specified.

After the erection of said line, having first given said company or its agents opportunity to be heard, the Municipal Officers may direct any alteration in the location or the erection of said posts and in the height of

the wires.

## Warrant for State Election

S. M. H. Paine Constable of the town of Eden,  
 You are hereby required in the name of the State  
 of Maine to notify and warn the inhabitants  
 of said town of Eden, qualified as the Con-  
 stitution requires to assemble at Music Hall on  
 the fourteenth day of September, nineteen hundred  
 and eight at which place in the forenoon to  
 give in their vote for governor, State Auditor, State  
 Senators, representatives to represent them in  
 the legislature of this State, County officers, and  
 representatives to Congress of the United States.

Also give in their vote on the following question:

(1) Shall the Constitution be amended as proposed  
 by a resolution of the legislature providing for the  
 establishment of a People's veto through the popular  
 referendum and a direct initiative by petition  
 and at general or special elections? (The same  
 being the question prescribed in Section 22 of  
 Chapter 121 of the Resolves of the Legislature of the State  
 of Maine approved March, 20, 1907.

Those in favor of this amendment will vote "yes,"  
 those opposed will vote "no," upon their ballots.

Also give in their vote on the following question:

(2) Shall Section two in Article ten of the Constitution,  
 as amended by the resolve of the fifty-eighth  
 legislature passed March fourth, eighteen hundred  
 and seventy-nine, and adopted September eighth,  
 eighteen hundred and seventy nine, be further  
 amended by striking out the words: "in the  
 manner prescribed by law, at their next biennial  
 meetings in the month of September," and inserting  
 in place thereof the words "to meet in the manner  
 prescribed by law for calling and holding biennial  
 meeting of said inhabitants for the election of  
 Senators and representatives on the second Monday  
 in September following the passage of said resolve,"  
 so that said section as amended, shall read  
 as follows:

Section 2. The Legislature whenever two thirds of both houses shall deem it necessary may propose amendments to this Constitution, and when any amendments shall be so agreed upon, a resolution shall be passed and sent to the Selectmen of the several towns and the assessors of the several plantations, informing and directing them to notify the inhabitants of their respective towns and plantations to meet in the manner prescribed by law for calling and holding biennial meetings of said inhabitants for the election of Senators and representatives, on the second Monday in September following the passage of said resolve, & give in their votes on the question whether such amendments shall be made.

And that if it shall appear that a majority of the inhabitants voting on the question are in favor of such amendment, it shall become a part of this Constitution." The same being the question to be submitted for the action of the legal voters under the provisions of Chapter 238 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Maine, approved March 28, 1907.

Those in favor of this amendment will vote "Yes"; those opposed will vote "No," upon their ballots.

The polls will be open at nine o'clock in the forenoon and be closed in the afternoon.

Brief, fail not, and have your share this year with your doing thereon.

The Selectmen will be in session at their office on the tenth eleventh and twelfth days of September, at nine o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
