## Warrant for Annual Town Meeting

State of Maine.

To George P. Billings, a constable of the town of Eden, within said County.

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Eden, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to meet at the Calais in Bar Harbor, in said town, on Monday, the seventh day of March A.D. 1910, at ten o'clock A.M., to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To hear reports of town officers and act thereon.

Article 4. To choose Selectmen for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To choose a member of the Board of Assessors.

Article 6. To choose a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 7. To choose a Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year.

Article 8. To choose an overseer or overseers of Poor.

Article 9. To choose a Road Commissioner for the eastern part of the town and define his limits.

Article 10. To choose a Road Commissioner for the western part of the town and define his limits.

Article 11. To choose a member of the Superintending School Committee.

Article 12. To choose an agent of the town school fund.

Article 13. To choose a Chief of Fire Department.

Article 14. To choose an Auditor of accounts.

Article 15. To choose all other necessary town officers.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote how the taxes shall be collected for the ensuing year.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote when taxes shall be due, what discount shall be allowed, and what interest shall be charged, if any, and for what time.

Article 18. To see if the town will fix the compensation of the Superintending School Committee.

Article 19. To see if the town will fix the compensation of the Treasurer and Collector.

Article 20. To raise money to defray town charges.

Article 21. To raise money to pay principal of town bonds and notes.

Article 22. To raise money to pay interest.

Article 23. To raise money for support of poor.

Article 24. To raise money for common schools.

Article 25. To raise money for free high school.

Article 26. To raise money for text books and supplies.

Article 27. To raise money for the repair of school property.

Article 28. To see if the town will raise a sum of money to provide for Manual training in the public schools.

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to have the marble tablet returned to the old Stevens school house at Bulls Gore.

Article 30. To see if the town will vote to sell and convey the old Stevens school house at Bulls Gore to the Stevens Neighborhood House Society, and authorize the selectmen to execute and deliver deed of the same.

Article 31. To see if the town will vote to instruct the School Board to properly repair the school house at Cotters Creek.

Article 32. To see if the town will vote to buy a lot of land to enlarge the Bulls Gore school lot and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 33. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to pay a physician for medical examination in our schools.

Article 34. To see if the town will vote to construct a new Fire Station at Bar Harbor, and raise a sum of money for the same.

Article 35. To raise money for the support of the Fire Department.

Article 36. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to complete the retaining wall with coping, extending westward from the end of Duck Brook Bridge to a stone pier at J. B. Henderson's walk.

Article 37. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to construct a drain on Eden Street in front of the properties of Mrs. Carpenter and Mrs. Cassall.

Article 38. To see if the town will vote to construct a sidewalk on Edgewood Street and raise a sum of money for the same.

Article 39. To see if the town will vote to continue the construction of the sidewalk at Ceter Creek to the Mount Desert line, and raise a sum of money for the same.

Article 40. To see if the town will vote to set curbing in front of the property of Mrs. J. J. Emery and Mrs. Alanson Tucker, providing they will construct the sidewalk, and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 41. To see if the town will raise money to repair and construct sidewalks in Bar Harbor.

Article 42. To see if the town will instruct the Road Commissioner to construct a drain on Shely Avenue.

Article 43. To see if the town will appropriate a sum of money to macadamize Ledgelawn Avenue from Pleasant Street to the Cromwell Harbor Road.

Article 44. To see if the town will vote to construct a Public Shed for sheltering horses, and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 45. To see if the town will vote that no contract, written or oral, for the furnishing of labor or material for any department of the town shall be awarded to any person holding any town office of trust or profit in that department.

Article 46. To see what action the town will take towards hiring the Casino by the year for annual and special town meetings, and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 47. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Treasurer to deposit the town's funds in some reliable bank or banks where a fair rate of interest will be paid on daily balances.

Article 48. To see if the town will provide house for Chemical Cart at Salisbury Cove and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 49. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907 relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for highways for the year 1908.

Article 50. To see if the town will raise, appropriate and set apart for the permanent improvement of the main highways within the town, such sums of money as are contemplated and directed by Section 5 of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907.

Article 51. To raise money for the repair of roads and bridges in the eastern part of the town.

Article 52. To raise money to sprinkle streets.

Article 53. To raise money to clean streets.

Article 54. To see if the town will vote to reconstruct the wall on the north side of West Street from the eastern side of Fifield & Joys store, westward, and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 55. To see if the town will vote to install an electric light on Bridge street, at the junction of Summer street, one on Mount Desert Street, opposite the St. Sauveur Hotel, and one on Main street near the Newport Driveway.

Article 56. To see if the town will vote to install electric lights on the Schooner Head Road from Mr. Kelle's to the stable of Charles Francis and Mr. Brigham.

Article 57. To raise money for lighting streets.

Article 57. To see what action the town will take with reference to making a contract with the Bar Harbor Water Company for a term of years for water for fire and municipal purposes and to authorize the selectmen to execute such a contract in behalf of the town.

Article 59. To raise money to pay for water for fire and municipal purposes.

Article 60. To see if the town will raise a sum of money for the extermination of the brown tail moth.

Article 61. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars for the Eden Agricultural Society.

Article 62. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the kindergarten.

Article 63. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars to pay the Bar Harbor Cadet Band for a series of open air concerts.

Article 64. To see if the town will appropriate a sum of money towards defraying the expenses of Memorial Day.

Article 65. To see if the town will raise a sum of money for the Village Library Association.

Article 66. To raise money for the services and expenses of the Board of Health.

Article 67. To raise money for the repair of sewers.

Article 68. To see if the town will vote to reconstruct main street sewer from Manhole No. 16 near the Cromwell Harbor Road to Manhole No. 20 near the Bar Harbor Water Co.'s office and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 69. To see if the town will vote to construct a macadamized road in the western part of the town and raise a sum of money for the same.

Article 70. To raise money for the repair of roads and bridges in the western part of the town.

Article 71. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to repair road leading from Town Hill road near the Thomas Knowles house to the farm buildings of J. L. Fogg and authorize said Fogg to expend the same under the direction of the Road Commissioner.

Article 72. To raise money to construct and repair sidewalks in Hulls Cove.

Article 73. To raise money to repair and construct sidewalks in Salisbury Cove.

Article 74. To raise money to repair and construct sidewalks in the Thomas district.

Article 75. To raise money to repair and construct sidewalks at West End.

Article 76. To see if the town will vote to construct a sidewalk along the Indian Point road from Aaron S. Bunker's to E. C. Sargent's residence, and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 77. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road leading from the County Road nearly opposite the house of Mrs. Melinda Quim, thence westerly by the house of Calvin Billington to the shore.

Article 78. To see if the town will vote to purchase a Cart and Chemicals for use at Hulls Cove, and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 79. To raise money for the disposal of garbage.

Article 80. To see what action the town will take with reference to making a contract for a time of years for the disposal of garbage and to authorize the selectmen to execute such contract in behalf of the town.

Article 81. To see if the town will appoint a Committee to investigate present methods of garbage disposal by incineration under high temperature in furnaces Municipally owned and operated and to report upon the same and their usefulness for Bar Harbor, and make appropriation for the expense of such investigation.

Article 82. To see what disposition the town will make of its set of Maine reports.

Article 83. To see if the town will fix the times in which claims may be taken within its limits, and the prices for which its municipal offices shall grant permits therefor.

Article 84. To raise money to pay discount on Taxes.

Article 85. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make a temporary loan in anticipation of taxes for 1910.

Article 86. To see if the town will authorize and instruct the Selectmen to negotiate for the sale and transfer of any property or properties for which it holds tax deeds, and to execute the proper release or transfer of same.

Article 87. To see if the town will vote to construct a sidewalk on West street from Bridge street to Holland avenue, and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 88. To see if the town will vote to construct a sidewalk on Ledgelawn avenue from a point opposite Cedar Lane southerly to the Cromwell Harbor Road, and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 89. To see if the town will vote to construct a surface drain on the Cliffstone and Devon Roads, and raise a sum of money for same.

Article 90. To see if the town will vote to accept a town way as laid out by the selectmen, beginning at a point in the western side line of School Street, in the village of Bar Harbor, and at the center of Wescott Place, so called, thence westerly along the center of said Wescott Place to Barron Court, so called.

Article 91. To see if the town will vote to accept a town way as laid out by the selectmen, beginning at a point in the eastern side line of Main Street, in the village of Bar Harbor, and at the center of Center street, thence easterly along the center of said Center street to the western side line of Snow Street.

Article 92. To see if the town will vote to accept a town way as laid out by the selectmen, beginning at a point in the western side line of Eden Street, in the village of Bar Harbor, and at the center of a private way next north of a building known as Chapman's Hall, and next south of Puble's Paint Shop, thence in a generally westerly direction to Central Avenue, so called, and raise a sum of money to construct the same.

Article 93. To see if the town will vote to construct a wall on the sides of the Suzzle Brook from Eden Street to a point where the town drain enters said brook, and raise a sum of money for the same.

Article 94. To see if the town will unite with some other town in forming a Union School District.

Article 95. To see if the town will vote to have the history of the town of Eden written by Mr. Eben Hamor printed in book form and provide a sum of money for the same.

Article 96. To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to apply to the next legislature for a charter authorizing the town to construct a set of water works, or establish a water district.

Article 97. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to apply to the next legislature to have the town of Eden divided by running a division line beginning at a point just west of the Caves at the Sand Point so called thence running in nearly a southerly direction until it intersects the line now dividing the town of Eden from the town of Mt. Desert. The eastern section to be known as the town of Bar Harbor and the western section to be known as the town of Eden.

Article 98. To see if the town will vote to pay all day laborers employed by the town not less than two dollars and fifty cents per day and also to increase the pay of any other employees of the town working by the day.

Article 99. To see if the town will adopt the following resolution:-  
"That all work on town buildings be done under the supervision of the building inspector unless there is a special committee for that purpose."

Article 100. To see if the town will buy a lot of land to be used as a cemetery and raise a sum of money for the same.

Article 101. To see if the town will accept a list of jurors as prepared by the Selectmen.

Article 102. To see if the town will instruct the road commissioner to construct a sidewalk on the west side of School street, from Mount Desert street to Pleasant street, and raise a sum of money for the same.
