Warrant For Special Town Meeting.

— Greetings. —

To George P. Billings, a Constable of the
Town, in said county, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine,
you are hereby required to notify and warn
the inhabitants of the town of Eden, aforesaid,
qualified by law to vote in town affairs to meet

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside
at said meeting.

Record of Special Town Meeting.

Held in Star Theatre, Bar Harbor, in the town of Eden, on Monday afternoon, Nov. 14th, 1910.

Meeting called to order by Town Clerk W. H. Sherman at 2 P.M. Warrant and constable's return read by the town clerk.

Article I. Julian Emery was unanimously elected moderator, Sworn by the town clerk.

Article 2:- L. B. Neary made the following motion which was carried:

Moved:--- That the town accept the Alteration of West street at and near the Western end thereof by discontinuing a part of its width on the Northwest side and widening the same upon the Southeast side all as shown by the return of the Municipal officers dated October 31, 1910 and filed in the Office of the Town Clerk.

Article 3--- L. B. Neary made the following motion which was carried:

Moved:--- That the town authorize and instruct the Municipal Officers in behalf of the Town to make and execute a deed to W. H. S. See of New York City, releasing and conveying to him all right, title and interest of the Town of Eden, however same may have been acquired in and to a parcel of land described as follows:

Bounded Southwesterly by Eden street, northwesterly by the Ells lot and the Dennison lot, formerly so-called, now owned by said W. H. S. See, bounded northeasterly by said Dennison lot and land of George S. Bowdoin and southeasterly by the Northwestern line of West street as altered by the Municipal Officers, October 31, 1910, and described in their return of that date.

Article 4:- L. B. Neary made the following motion which was carried:

Moved:— That the Town authorize and instruct the Municipal Officers to deliver said above described deed to said W.H.S. Lee upon receiving from him a release of all land damages sustained by him on account of the alterations of West street as described in the return of said officers and dated October 31, 1910.

Article 5:— Voted to indefinitely postpone.

E.S. Clark made a motion to reconsider the action whereby this article was indefinitely postponed, which was lost,

Article 6:— Voted to indefinitely postpone.

Article 7:— Voted to reconstruct the sewer on Rebo street as described in Article 7 and that the municipal officers be, and hereby are authorized to issue the town's negotiable notes for \$1000 to provide funds to construct same.

Article 8:— Voted that the town construct a sewer on the Livingston road and that the municipal officers be and are hereby authorized to issue the town's negotiable note for a sum not exceeding \$500. to construct said sewer.

Voted to adjourn.

Alteration of West Street. Petition for ex.
See Acceptance on Page 297. See Page 304
- Return. -

In accordance with the petition hereto prefixed signed by L. B. Neasy and others, inhabitants and owners of cultivated land in the Town of Eden, Hancock County, Maine, and as required by Statutes, we the undersigned Municipal Officers of the Town of Eden gave due and legal notice of our intention to alter the town way as described in said notice by causing the said notice to be posted for seven days at least in two public places in said Town of Eden and in the vicinity of said way, to wit: we caused said notice to be posted on October 24 A.D. 1910 at the office of the selectmen, Bar Harbor in said Town of Eden and at an Electric Light pole near the corner of West and Eden Streets, Bar Harbor in said Eden, both said places being public place in said Town of Eden and in the vicinity of said way.

Pursuant to said notice we met at the time and place appointed, to wit; on Monday the thirty-first day of October 1910 at 9 o'clock in the forenoon at the corner of Eden and West Streets, Bar Harbor in said Town of Eden, and heard all parties interested and examined the location and route of the proposed alteration. Whereupon after such examination and hearing, we decided and determined to make such alteration, and we do hereby alter said town way known as West Street in that part of the same lying between Eden Street and land of George S. Bowdin as follows:

We establish as the northwestern line of said portion of said street a line described as follows: Beginning at a stone post set in the ground bearing south sixty-five degrees and ten minutes East and distant 16.8 feet from an iron bolt set in the ground in the northeastern side of the county way known as Eden Street;

thence running North sixty-three degrees thirty-five minutes East but everywhere following the Northwestern edge of the sidewalk as now constructed 106 feet more or less; thence in a northeasterly direction but everywhere following the Northwestern face of the West Street retaining wall as now constructed on the Northeastern side of said West Street 131 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet more or less to the Western line of said Land of George S. Bowdoin.

All parts of said West Street lying northerly and northwesterly of the line next here in above described to be discontinued.

We also further alter said way by widening the same upon the Southern and South-eastern side so that the Southern and South-eastern line from Eden Street to Land of George S. Bowdoin shall be as follows:

Beginning at a point in the Northwestern side of Eden Street 17.1 feet distant Southeastly from the junction of said Eden Street and West Street as now established, said point of beginning being marked by an iron bolt set in the ground; thence North five degrees forty minutes East 8.25 feet to an iron bolt set in the ground; thence North eleven degrees fifty-five minutes East 7.29 feet to an iron bolt set in the ground; thence North fifteen degrees thirty-three minutes East 7.83 feet to an iron bolt set in the ground; thence North, thirty-three degrees fifty minutes East 15.12 feet to an iron bolt set in the ground; thence North forty-one degrees forty-seven minutes East 17.32 feet to an iron bolt set in the ground; thence North fifty-two degrees nine minutes East 24.85 feet to an iron bolt set in the ground; thence North fifty-five degrees fifty-seven minutes East 19.75 feet to an iron bolt set in the ground; thence North fifty-six degrees twenty-seven minutes East 31.50 feet to an iron bolt set in the ground; thence North fifty-seven degrees forty-seven minutes East 22.42 feet to an iron bolt set in the ground;
