Warrant For Special State Election.

— 1911. —

To Otha H. Ellison, Constable of the town of Eden. You are hereby required in the name of the State of Maine, to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Eden, qualified as the constitution requires, to assemble at the Casino on the eleventh day of September, nineteen hundred and eleven, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to give in their vote on the following:

Question One.

Shall the constitution be amended so as to abrogate and annul the twenty-sixth amendment adopted on the eight day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, relating to the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors?

The same being the question prescribed in Sec. I of Chap. 35 of the Resolves of the Legislature of the State of Maine, approved March 2, 1911,

Those in favor of this Resolve will vote "Yes", those opposed will vote "No", upon their ballots.

Also to give in their vote on the following question.

Question Two.

Shall the constitution be amended as proposed by resolution of the legislature providing that "Augusta is hereby declared to be the seat of government of this state"? The same being the question prescribed in Sec. I of Chap. 216 of the Resolves of the Legislature of the State of Maine, approved March 31, 1911.

Those in favor of this Resolve will vote "Yes", those opposed will vote "No", upon their ballots.

Also to give in their vote on the following question.

Question Three.

Shall the constitution be amended as proposed by resolution of the legislature providing that the towns having a population of forty thousand inhabitants or more, according to the last census taken by the United States, be permitted to create a debt or liability which single or in the aggregate equals seven and one-half per centum of its last regular valuation and that the increase in amount of debt be no greater than one-quarter of one per centum over the present rate of five per cent. in any one year? The same being the question prescribed in Sec. I. of Chap. 221, of the Resolves of the Legislature of the State of Maine, approved March 31, 1911.

Those in favor of this resolve will vote "Yes"; those opposed will vote "No", upon their ballots.

Question Four.

"An act to provide for nomination of candidates of political parties by primary elections" whereby "all nominations of candidates for any State or County office, including United States Senator, member of Congress and member of the State Legislature, shall here after be made at and by primary elections held in accordance with the provisions of this act." The same being submitted by authority of the Proclamation of the Governor.

Those in favor of this resolve will vote "Yes", those opposed will vote "No", upon their ballots.

The polls will be opened at ten o'clock in the forenoon and be closed at five o'clock in the afternoon.

Hereof fail not, and have you there this Warrant with your doings thereon.

The selectmen will be in session at Selectmen's Office, on the ninth day of Sept. at nine o'clock in

the afternoon for the purpose of correcting
the list of voters.
