Surveying.

Pursuant to the above petition and notice, both of which are expressly referred to and made a part of this return, we the undersigned, municipal officers of the Town of Eden, Hancock County, State of Maine, having given written notice of our intentions by posting up notices, of which the foregoing is a true copy, in three public places in said town of Eden and in the vicinity of said way, to wit: one on a telephone pole on the east side of Main Street near "Livingston Road" one on the east side of Glen Mary Road near its junction with Cedar Lane, and one in the office of the Selectmen of the Town of Eden, said notices having been posted on the seventeenth day of February A.D. 1912, being at least seven days prior to the time of the laying out of said way, met and at the time and place specified in said notices, to wit: at the office building of the Bar Harbor or Water Co. on Main Street in said Town of Eden at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the twenty-fourth day of February A.D. 1912, and for the purpose therein specified and at said meeting we heard the petitioners and all others interested and after hearing and fully understanding the matter we determined to lay out a Town Way for the use of said Town as prayed for by said petitioners and we accordingly laid out said way as a Town Way substantially following the route described in said petition and specifically described as follows to wit:

Beginning at a point in the west line of Main Street, in the Village of Bar Harbor, said point being in a production westerly of the north line of Livingston Road and forty-seven (47) feet westerly from a stone post set in the ground marking the intersection of the north line of Livingston Road with the east line of Main Street; thence running on a further production westerly of the said north line of Livingston Road, the magnetic bearing at this date being North 84 degrees, West some thousand two hundred and twelve (1212) feet crossing School Street, Ash Street, and

Hedgawn Avenue, to a point in the east line of "Glen Mary" Road, said point being eighty and twenty-five hundredths (80.25) feet northerly of a stone post set in the ground marking the intersection of the east line of Glen Mary Road with the north line of Cedar Hand; thence following the east line of said Glen Mary Road northerly fifty (50) feet; thence South 84 degrees East parallel with and fifty (50) feet distant from the line first above described, one thousand two hundred and twelve (1212) feet, to the west side line of Main St, thence following the west side line of said Main St, northerly fifty (50) feet to the place of begining.

The way is to be fifty (50) feet wide in all its parts and the above described lines enclose the strip of land condemned.

The length of the way is one thousand two hundred and twelve (1212) feet, made up as follows: from Main St, to School St, five hundred and ten (510) feet across School Street thirty three (33) feet, School Street to Ash Street two hundred and five tenths (200.5) feet, across Ash Street thirty (30) feet, Ash Street to Hedgawn Avenue one hundred and ninety-eight and five tenths (198.5) feet, across Hedgawn Ave, fifty (50) feet, and from Hedgawn Ave, to Glen Mary Road one hundred and ninety (190) feet.
