Pursuant to the above petition and notice, both of which are expressly referred to and made a part of this return, we, the undersigned Municipal Officers of the Town of Eden, Hancock County, State of Maine, having given written notice of our intentions by posting up notices, of which the foregoing is a true copy, in two public places in the said Town of Eden and in the vicinity of said way; to wit: one on the building known as Hapworth Hall on Eden Street, near Eddy's Brook, so called, and one in the office of the Selectmen of said Town of Eden, said notices having been posted on January the thirtieth A.D. 1912, being at least seven days prior to the time of laying out said way, met and at the time and place specified in said notice, to wit: at the paint shop of George H. Haple in said town of Eden at ten o'clock in the forenoon and for the purposes therein specified, and at said meeting we heard the petitioners and all other persons interested, and after hearing and fully understanding the matter, we determined to lay out a Town Way for the use of said Town as prayed. for by said petitioners and we accordingly laid out said way, as a Town Way, substantially affording the route described in said petition and specifically described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a point in the southeasterly side line of Eden Street, said point being twenty and one tenth (20.1) feet northerly of the northwest corner of land of H. S. Hapworth and from thence running south 89 degrees 20' west eighty-nine and three tenths 89.3 feet; thence south 78 degrees 35' west one hundred and fifty-nine and seventeenth (159.7) feet, thence south 60 degrees 25' west one hundred and twenty-seven and one tenth (127.1) feet; thence south 80 degrees 25' west twenty-four and five tenths (24.5) feet; thence north 67 degrees 11' west one hundred and six and thirty-five hundredths (106.35) feet.

thence North 51 degrees 56' West fourteen and five tenths (14.5) feet; thence north 35 degrees 17' west seventeen and six tenths (17.6) feet to a stone post set in the ground in the northerly side line of Central Ave., said stone post marking the northwesterly corner of the stable lot of W. E. Montgomery.

The way shall be sixteen (16) feet wide, except along the first course, the southerly line of which shall begin at the ^{southern} corner of the Hapwater lot and run to a point sixteen (16) feet southerly of the line above described opposite the first angle in said line. The above described line shall be the northerly side line of said way and said way is over a right of way conveyed to Albert S. Higgins and others by the Mount Desert Island Real Estate Company by Deed dated June 20th, 1889, and recorded in the Hancock County Registry of Deeds Vol. 23⁴, page 423.

We also determined that no damages are sustained by any person or persons by the laying out of said way, and we therefore award no land damages.

Such laying out of the above described way with the boundaries and admeasurements have been filed with the Town Clerk of the Town of Eden aforesaid, on the 23rd day of Feb. A.D., being seven days before this meeting and we hereby report such laying out of the above described way with the boundaries and admeasurements of the same to said Town at a meeting of the inhabitants regularly warned and notified, for them to accept and allow the same.
