## By-laws adopted by Board of Health:

To the Honorable A. W. King, Justice of the Supreme  
Judicial Court, of the State of Maine:

The local board of health of the Town of Eden,  
County of Hancock, State of Maine, respectfully  
represents that the said board of health has made  
and adopted, and does make and adopt for said  
Town of Eden, the by-laws annexed hereto, and  
numbered from Article 1 to Article 8, inclusive, and  
prays that the same may be approved, as by  
statute provided.

Local Board of Health  
of Town of Eden.

At a meeting of the local board of health of the Town of Eden, Hancock County, Maine, held at Bar Harbor in said Eden, on Wednesday, July, third, 1912, at which meeting J. Alden Morse, Robert E. Stanley, and Walter E. Buid, being the entire local board of health of said Eden, were present and acting, it was unanimously voted to make and adopt for said Town of Eden, the by-laws hereinafter set forth in articles from one to eight inclusive.

It was also unanimously voted by said board that such by-laws are necessary and proper for the preservation of life and health and the successful operation of the health laws of the State.

Article 1 - From and after the date that these by-laws become effective, no long hopper water closet shall be set up, constructed or installed, and any such long hopper water closet now in use shall be removed or abandoned whenever the local board of health shall so order.

No person shall set up, construct, or install any such long hopper water closet and no person shall maintain or use any such closet after the same has, by the local board of health, been ordered to be removed or abandoned.

Article 2 - No person shall by himself or servant between June 15th and September 15th, in any year, convey or transport any manure, offal, or garbage in or through any public road or street between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon.

Article 3 - No person shall, without a license from the local board of health, keep on his premises or have on his possession pigs at any time, and no person shall without such license keep on his premises or have in his possession hens, ducks, geese, or fowl of any kind, during the months of May, June, July, August and September.

Licenses for above purposes may be granted by the local board of health for such periods not exceeding one year, as said board deems proper and such licenses may at any time be revoked by the local board of health. Any licenses granted by said board shall become void and of no effect upon such revocation and notice of the same to the licensee.

Article 4- The last paragraph of Article 4, of the by-laws of the Town of Eden, adopted April 5th, 1907, and approved by S. A. Emery, Chief Justice, on April 23rd, 1907, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:-

"The hours for receiving at the dump wharf are as follows: From April first to November first, from ten A. M. and five to ten P. M.; from November first to April first, eight A. M. to four P. M.

Article 5- Barns and stables in which cows are kept by persons producing milk to be sold by milk dealers shall be kept clean and well ventilated, the water supply pure and well situated and food of good quality. Animals shall be kept clean and attendants shall observe cleanliness in person. Milk shall be strained, stored, and kept in a clean place. All persons who produce milk to be sold by dealers shall keep and observe the requirements of this by-law.

Article 6- The local board of health or milk inspector shall make at least two inspections annually and in making such inspections shall examine into the ventilation and light of barns and stables used for the keeping of cows, milk from which shall be sold by dealers. Such board shall examine into the health and cleanliness of animals, conditions of apparatus of collecting and distributing milk, situations of water supply, variety and quality of food, cleanliness of attendants and, if they deem it necessary, shall subject the milk of any producer to a proper and satisfactory test for the determination of its specific gravity and its quality.

Article 7- The following by-laws of the Town of Eden are hereby expressly repealed, to wit, Article 9 of the by-laws adopted April 5th, 1907, and approved April 23rd, 1907, by Honorable S. A. Emery, Chief Justice, and Articles 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16 adopted May 21st, 1908 and approved by Honorable A. W. King, Justice of Supreme Judicial Court.

Article 8- The above by-laws numbered from one to four inclusive shall apply only to that part of said Town of Eden embraced within the limits described in Article 13 of the by-laws of said Town, adopted April 5th, 1907 and approved April 23rd, 1907.
