Record of Special Town meeting

Held at the Casino, in Bar Harbor in the town of Eden, on Wednesday the 24th day of July A.D. 1912 at eleven o'clock in the forenoon.

Meeting called to order by the clerk, who read the warrant and the constable's return thereon.

Article 1

Horatio Wakefield was unanimously elected moderator! Sworn by the town clerk.

Article 2

E. N. Benson made a motion that when the vote is taken under Article 2, it be by "yea" and "no" ballots. Carried.

H. L. Graham made the following motion:-
That the town purchase the lot of land situated on the shore path, in the village of Bar Harbor, known as the Julius C. S. Grant lot, for public Park purposes, and that the town authorize and instruct the selectmen to issue the towns negotiable bonds in the sum of Twenty-one thousand dollars for the purpose of paying for said lot of land. Said bonds to be registered and denominated "Town of Eden Park Bonds" dated September first, 1912, payable in fifteen years from date, to bear interest at the rate of four per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and are to be executed by the selectmen and treasurer, negotiated by the selectmen who are authorized for the purpose to employ such agents or bankers as they deem necessary.

That the form and terms of said bonds except so far as the form and terms are fixed by the foregoing motion shall be determined by the selectmen.

Motion carried, 68 voting "yea" and 4 voting "no".

New England Tel. and Telegraph Co. Permit to ~~dig~~^{manholes.} underground conduits

In Board of Selectmen
Eden, Maine.

Ordered:

That permission be and hereby is granted the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company to lay and maintain underground conduits and manholes, with the wires and cables to be placed therein, under the surface of the following streets.

Mt. Desert St., between Main St, and Eden St,

Also that permission be and hereby is granted the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company to erect and maintain distributing poles, with the wires to be placed thereon, at suitable points in such portions of said street as may be occupied by conduits constructed under this order, and on any street intersecting any such portion of any of said streets, at or near the point of intersection; also to lay and maintain underground conduits, manholes, cables and wires for the purpose of making connections with said poles and with existing poles it may desire to use for distributing purposes, and for making building connections with its said conduits on the above or intersecting streets.

The foregoing permission is subject to the following conditions.

1. The conduits and manholes shall be of such material and construction and all work done in such manner as to be satisfactory to the Board of Selectmen or to such officers as it may appoint to the supervision of the work, and a plan showing the location of conduit constructed, and of distributing poles erected shall be filed with the Town when the work is completed.
2. In every underground conduit constructed by said Company one duct not less than three inches in diameter shall be reserved and
