Bar Harbor & Union River Power Company  
Permit to Erect and Maintain Poles

In Board of Selectmen

Eden, Maine, May 23, 1912.

Ordered:

That the Bar Harbor and Union River Power Company be and it is hereby authorized and permitted to erect and maintain poles and wires to be placed thereon, together with such supporting and strengthening fixtures and wires as said Company may deem requisite, in the streets and highways of said town as hereinafter designated.

All construction under this permit shall be in accordance with the following specifications: The poles shall be located between the travelled driveway and the limits of the highway, shall be set firmly in the ground, and shall be of wood or other suitable material, and the wires shall be run at the usual height and along and across the highway. After the poles and wires have been located as specified in this permit, alterations shall be made in the location or erection of the poles, and in the height of the wires, if so directed by the Board of Selectmen. Following are the streets and highways above referred to:

Snow Street from Wayman Lane to Livingston Road

Oliver Street from Main Street to Snow Street.

Stawood Place from Main Street to Bar Harbor Hospital.

Federal Street from Cottage Street to line of land of C. Morrison.

It is further adjudged and voted that satisfactory proof has been made that the public notice required by Chapter 55, Section 17, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, 1903, has been given upon the petition of said Company to erect poles with the wires thereon in the streets and highways of Eden, Me., designated by this permit.

Special Town Meeting  
Held in Barre, April 28, 1913.  
Called to order by Clerk, W. H. Sherman.

Article 1.

H. D. Wakefield, elected moderator, sworn by Clerk.

Article 2.

Chas. F. Paine read report of the Committee appointed at the Annual meeting to look into poor farm proposition.

Voted:

To accept report and that Committee be discharged.

Article 3.

Voted:

To indefinitely postpone.

Article 4.

Voted:

To indefinitely postpone.

Article 5.

Voted:

That the Selectmen be and hereby are authorized to issue the towns negotiable 4% bonds in the sum of \$9500, to be denominated "Town of Eden Funding Bonds" and to mature September 1, 1928.

Article 6.

To adopt the following By-laws.

Voted, That the Town accept and adopt the following By-laws of the Town of Eden, providing for traffic and driving regulations.

Article 1.

Vehicles in motion.

Section 1.

A vehicle meeting another shall pass on the right.

Section 2.

A vehicle overtaking another shall pass on the left side of the overtaken vehicle and not pull over to the right until entirely clear of it.

Section 3.

A vehicle turning into another street to the right shall turn the corner as near the right-hand curb as practicable thus:

Section 4.

A vehicle turning into another street to the left shall turn around the center of the intersection of the two streets, thus:

Section 5.

No vehicle unless in an emergency or to allow another vehicle or pedestrian to cross its pass, or to take on or let off passengers, shall stop in any public street or highway, except near the right hand curb thereof, so as not to obstruct the crossing.

Article 2.Signals.Section 1.

In slowing up or stopping a signal shall be given to those behind by raising the whip or hand vertically.

Section 2.

In turning while in motion or in starting to turn from a standstill, a signal shall be given by raising the whip or hand indicating with it the direction in which the turn is to be made.

Section 3.

Before backing ample warning shall be given, and while backing unceasing vigilance must be exercised not to injure those behind.

Section 4.

Drivers of motor vehicles of all kinds shall in approaching or in rounding a corner or curve of a public street sound their signals in such a way as to give warning to other vehicles and to pedestrians of their approach.

Section 5.

Every automobile, motor vehicle, or vehicle drawn by horses or other domestic animals shall carry a lighted lamp between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise.

Article 3.Right of Way.Section 1.

A vehicle waiting at the curb shall promptly give place to a vehicle about to take on or let off passengers or freight.

Section 2.

The driver of a vehicle, on the approach of a fire engine or any other fire apparatus (answering an alarm of fire) shall immediately draw up said vehicle as near as practicable to the right hand curb and parallel thereto and bring it to a standstill.

Article 4Speed.Section 1.

No automobile or motor vehicle shall be driven or operated upon any highway, byway, or public street in the town of Eden at a greater rate of speed than ten miles an hour, within the following described limits, to wit:

From the corner of Eden and West streets up Eden street to Kebo street, thence up Kebo street to the Cromwells Harbor road, thence down Cromwells Harbor road to Main street, thence up Main street to West street, thence over West street to Eden street, and all streets within said limits, including those above named.

Article 5.Age Limit.Section 1.

No one shall drive a public, numbered, licensed or business vehicle who is less than sixteen years of age.

Article 6.Control of Horses and Vehicles Standing.Section 1.

No horse shall be left unattended in any street or highway unless securely fastened and no horse shall at any time be tied within twenty-five feet of the corner of any street.

Section 2.

No vehicle shall stop or stand within the intersection of any street, nor within ten feet of a street corner.

Section 3.

No person having charge of a vehicle shall obstruct any street by stopping the same abreast of another vehicle except in case of an emergency.

Article 7.Definitions.Section 1.

The word driver includes the driver of a horse, the rider of wheels, and the operator of a motor vehicle.

Article 8.Obedience.Section 1.

Drivers must at all times comply with any direction by voice or hand of any member of the police force as to stopping, starting, approaching or departing from any place.

the manner of taking up or letting off of passengers,  
or loading or unloading goods in any place.

Article 9

Punalties

Section 1.

All drivers upon the public streets of the town of Edon, Hancock County, Maine, shall conform to the above by-laws.

Section 2.

Any person who shall violate the above by-laws or either of them shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding ten dollars for the first offence, and for any subsequent offence by a fine of not exceeding twenty dollars. Said penalties shall be recovered for the use of said town of Edon, by complaint before any Municipal Court in the County of Hancock.
