Road Extension.

Accepted partially as laid out beginning at Livingston Road extension and extending for a distance of 2675 feet and not further than the north line of C. Harrison Coates' land, at March meeting, 1913.

To the Honorable Board of Municipal Officers of the Town of Eden, Hancock County, Maine.

The undersigned Inhabitants of the Town of Eden aforesaid, respectfully petition your Honorable Board to lay out and widen a town way at Bar Harbor in said Town of Eden, as follows:

Beginning at a point in the South line in the extension Westerly of Livingston Road and 4.5 feet Westerly of the center line of School Street as now laid out; thence Southerly parallel with and 4.5 feet distant from said center line of School Street 605 feet; thence in a Southwesterly direction, crossing land of Mt. Desert Transit Co., Cromwell Harbor Road and land of George B. Snow 1118 feet more or less to a point in the center line of Ledgebawn Avenue Extension just North of Bridge No. 21 (State Record) thence following said Ledgebawn Avenue Extension Southerly to its junction with the Northerly side line of Harden Farm Road, a distance of 3430 feet more or less. The above described line to be the center line of said way and the way to be 50 feet wide in all its parts. The total distance is 5153 feet.

In accordance with the petition hereto prefixed, signed by F. J. Nash and nine others, inhabitants of the town of Eden, aforesaid, and as required by statute, we the undersigned, Municipal Officers of said town of Eden, gave due and legal notice of our intention to lay out and widen a town way by causing the within notice, a copy of which is above set forth, to be posted for seven days in two public places of the town of Eden, Hancock County, Maine, and in the vicinity of the proposed way, to wit: We caused said notice to be posted on February 15th, 1913, one at the Municipal offices in the Grant Block, Bar Harbor, in said town of Eden, and one on a pole at the junction of Sedgeclaw Avenue and the Cromwell's Harbor Road, in said Bar Harbor, in the vicinity of the proposed way.

Pursuant to said notice we met at the time and place appointed, to wit, on Saturday, the 22nd day of February, A. D. 1913, at the municipal offices, in Grant Block, at Bar Harbor, in said Eden, at half past nine o'clock in the forenoon and heard the parties and repaired to the route of the proposed way and examined the same.

Whereupon, after such examination and hearing, we determined to widen and lay out said way and did widen and lay out the same as a town way, with the following bounds and measurements:

Beginning at a point in the South side line of an extension westerly of Livingston Road so-called, and 4.6 feet westerly of the center line of School Street; thence running South $6^{\circ}45'$ West, but parallel with and 4.5 feet from the center line of School Street as now laid out 591 feet; thence deflecting to the right on a regular curve whose radius is 138.47 feet and whose central angle is $50^{\circ}58'123.17$ feet to the point of tangency of said curve; thence South $57^{\circ}43'$ West 310 feet; thence deflecting to the right on a regular curve whose radius is 340.64 and whose central angle is $13^{\circ}77.15$ feet to the point of tangency of said curve; thence South $70^{\circ}43'$ West 30 feet; thence deflecting to the left on a regular curve whose radius is 399.32 feet and whose central angle is $50^{\circ}209.18$ feet to the point of tangency of said curve; thence South $40^{\circ}43'$ West 247 feet; thence deflecting to the left on a regular curve whose radius is 315.56 feet and whose central angle is $35^{\circ}30'195.6$ feet to the point of tangency of said curve; thence South $5^{\circ}13'$ West, 219 feet; thence deflecting to the right on a regular curve whose radius is 502.7 feet and whose central angle is $32^{\circ}30', 197.4$ feet to the point of tangency of said curve; thence South $38^{\circ}15'$ West 597.5 feet; thence deflecting to the left in a regular

Curve whose radius is 771.68 feet and whose central angle is $22^{\circ} 24' 6.3$ feet to the point of tangency of said curve; thence South $6^{\circ} 15'$ West 1958.7 feet to the northerly side line of the Harden Farm Road, a total distance of 5052 feet. The above described line is to be the center-line of the way and the way is to be 50 feet wide in every part and passes over land of Mt. Desert Transit Company, George B. Slow, Mears, Morrison and Steary, George B. Slow, C. Harrison Coates, B. B. Boney, James W. Walport, Alvah S. Abbott et al, Ora G. Strait, George B. Slow, Town of Eden, Small + Ingalls, and Nathan Ash.

So much of the above described way as follows existing roads, to wit, School Street and Ledge Low Avenue Extension, so-called, we have widened, and so much of said above described way as departs from said existing roads we have laid out anew as authorized by statute.

We award no land damages for same.

Such laying out, with the boundaries and admeasurements, has been filed with the town clerk of said town of Eden, Hancock County, Maine, on the twenty second day of February, A. D. 1913, being at least seven days before this meeting, and we now hereby report such laying out with the boundaries and admeasurements of the same, to said town, at the meeting of the inhabitants regularly warned and notified for them to accept and allow the same.

Collector's Return To Town Clerk of Tax Sales
State of Maine.

To W. H. Sherman, Clerk of the Town of Eden in the
County of Hancock and State of Maine:

Pursuant to law I caused the taxes assessed on the
real estate of non-resident owners described herein,
situated in the Town of Eden, for the year 1912, to be
advertised according to law by advertising in the Bar
Harbor Record, a newspaper published in said County,
three weeks successively, the first publication being on
the eighteenth day of December, 1912, and at least
six weeks before the day of sale; and caused the taxes
assessed on the real estate of resident owners, described
herein, situated in the Town of Eden, for the year 1912,
to be advertised according to law by posting notices as
required by law at the following places, at the Post
Office at Bar Harbor, the Post Office at Hulls Cove, at
the Post Office at Salisbury Cove, the Post Office at Eden,

and conspicuous places in said town, at least six
weeks before the day of sale, to wit, on the twenty-
first day of December 1912; I also, at least ten days
before the day of sale, to wit, on the sixteenth day
of January, 1913, gave to each resident owner of said
lands, or the occupant thereof, if any, in hand, or left
at his last, and usual place of abode, and sent by
mail to the last and usual address of each non-
resident owner of said land, whose address was
known to me, written notice of the time and place
of said sale, and the amount of taxes due, in the
manner provided by law.

And afterwards, on the first Monday of February,
1913, at the Casino in Bar Harbor in said Eden, at
nine o'clock in the forenoon, being the time and place
of sale, I proceeded to sell according to the tenor of the
advertisement the estates upon which the taxes so
assessed remained unpaid to the persons and for the
sums set forth in the schedule forming a part of
this return, the same having been struck off to the
said persons, they being the highest bidders therefor, and
it being necessary to sell said amount of real estate so
taxed and advertised as aforesaid and no person offering
to pay said taxes and interest and charges for a smaller
fractional part of said land, at a public auction,
legally notified, as hereinbefore set forth and held at the

Casino in Bay Harbor in said Eden (being the place where the last preceding Annual Town Meeting was held) on the first Monday in February, 1913, at nine o'clock A.M. when and where I, the said Collector, exposed said property for sale and offered to sell such fractional parts thereof as were necessary to pay such taxes and charges and could not obtain bids for any smaller fractional parts thereof than those set forth in the said schedules; and I have made and executed deeds of the several parcels sold to the several persons entitled thereto, and placed them on file in the Town Treasurer's office, to be disposed of as the law requires; and lodged my certificate of said tax sales with the Town Treasurer within thirty days after the day of sale.
