Record of a Special Town Meeting.

Pursuant to the foregoing warrant the legal voters of the town of Eden assembled in the Casino Bar Harbor, in said Eden, on May ninth, A. D. 1914. In the absence of the town clerk, the Selectmen appointed H. L. Graham Esq., as clerk pro tempore.

Mr. Graham, being duly sworn, called the meeting to order and read the warrant and the constable's return thereon.

Article 1 - Horatio H. Wakefield was unanimously elected moderator and was sworn by the clerk.

Article 2 - On motion of Joseph Wood: Voted: That the town authorize the Selectmen to make a contract with the State Highway Commission for the construction of the state aid road from Burns corner to the Trenton town line, under section 11, of Chapter 130, of the Laws of 1913.

The foregoing vote was by "yes" and "no" ballots, 98 voting "yes" and 44 voting "no".

The following resolution was introduced by Chas. H. Wood Esq.:

Resolved: That it is the sense of the voters of this meeting that the plans and specifications for this state aid road be so revised that the 2.44 miles can be fully completed for the \$12,000 available. Carried.

The following resolution was introduced by Frank Nash:

Resolved: That the town extend the labor union jurisdiction to the town limits. Carried.
