Order to Destroy Buildings.

The undersigned, Municipal Officers, of the town of Eden, Hancock County, Maine, hereby give notice to the owners of the following described buildings, to wit: The building situated on South Street next south of the shop of Guthrie & Wilsons and known as the W. H. Mitchell's blacksmith shop, sheds in the rear of the Ralph Robbins house on the north side of South Street, house on the lot in the rear of the Ellsworth Foundry and Machine Works, blacksmith shop on Cottage Street known as the O. H. Stevens shop, store house on the east side of School Street next south from the American House and known as the J. C. The Bar Harbor and Union River Power Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Maine and doing business at Bar Harbor and other places in said state hereby makes application for a written permit and an alteration of a written permit, under Revised Statutes of the State of Maine, Chapter 55, Section 17, and represents.

That it has a line of posts and wires for the transmission of light and power along the Eagle Lake Road so called, at Bar Harbor in said town of Edew, for the construction and maintenance of which it has previously applied for and obtained from the Selectmen of said town of Edew, the written permit therefore authorized by said Chapter 55 of the Revised Statutes; that your Honorable Board has directed an alteration in such original permit as to the location of five of its posts on said Eagle Lake Road, namely the five posts situated along the northwesterly side of said Eagle Lake Road between Forest Street and house of Eben Parsons, being posts numbered as follows, the numbering being from southwest to northeast, to wit, numbers 879, 880, 881, 882, and 883, and such removal being absolutely necessary, owing to repairs and alterations of the road, said corporation has removed said posts, together with wires and fixtures.
