Protection and Preservation of Moose in the State.

- State of Maine -

- Public Notice -

In conformity with the provisions of Section 15, of Chapter 32, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, as amended by Chapter 206 of the public laws of 1913, deeming it for the best interest of the State, the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game, after due notice to all persons interested, and public hearing in the locality to be affected, and deeming it necessary and proper for the protection and preservation of moose in the State, hereby adopt the following needful Rules and Regulations relating to the hunting of moose on Mount Desert Island, in the County of Hancock:

- Rules and Regulations -

For a period of three years from November first, A. D., 1914 it shall be unlawful to hunt, take, catch, kill or destroy any moose at any time on Mount Desert Island, Hancock County. During the same period it shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession any moose, or part thereof, taken in violation of these regulations.

Section 15 and 16, Chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter 206, P. L. 1913: Whoever hunts, takes, catches, kills or destroys any inland game, in any manner or at any time, in violation of any of the rules and regulations of the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, made and promulgated in conformity with the provisions of this Chapter, shall be punished in the same manner and to the same extent as is provided for by law for the illegal taking, catching, killing or destroying of any inland game.

Whoever wilfully mutilates, defaces, or destroys any notice, rule or regulation of the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, posted in conformity with the provisions of this Chapter, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars.

The undersigned, Frank Spratt, of said Town of Eden, intends to build and extend a wharf in tide waters, within the limits of said Town of Eden. The location, limits and boundaries of such intended erection and extension being as follows:
