Frank Spratt To Town of Eden.
 Memorandum of Agreement

Made for the disposal of garbage for the Town of Eden, made and entered into this 28th day of November, A.D. 1914, by and between Frank Spratt of the Town of Eden, Hancock County, Maine, party of the first part, and the Inhabitants of the Town of Eden, a municipal corporation in said County of Hancock, a party of the second part.

This Agreement Witnesseth: -

That the party of the first part in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, on the part of the party of the second part to be performed, does hereby covenant and agree with the party of the second part, as follows: -

First: -

That he will destroy and dispose of in the manner, at the time and the place hereinafter specified, and to the reasonable satisfaction of the Board of Health of the Town of Eden, all the garbage that may be made or accumulated in the village of Bar Harbor and vicinity in said Eden, and brought to him at the landing hereinafter specified, from April 1, 1915 to March 31, 1916, inclusive.

Second: -

That he will destroy and dispose of said garbage as follows: All of said garbage that is floatable and that is combustible in form brought to him, shall be destroyed by burning in a suitable furnace, arranged with dumping and stack, or stacks at least sevenly-five feet in height above the top of the grates of said furnace, and satisfactory to the Board of Health, for the full term of this contract, and the rest of said garbage unless taken care of and destroyed to the satisfaction of said Board of Health, shall be carried in a suitable conveyance and dumped into the sea, at a buoy located by the party of the first part, under the direction of the Board of Health, at a distance of not less than a mile in the direction easterly from Bald Porcupine, for the first seven months of each year beginning with April 1, 1915, during said term.

Third: -

That for the purpose of receiving, destroying and disposing of garbage as above specified, the said Spratt will provide a suitable conveyance and suitable and sufficient wharf and landing, said wharf to be cribbed up from the ground to a height and in a manner satisfactory to said Board of Health, and shed or sheds for covering said garbage and a furnace for destroying such of it as is to be destroyed as above stated. Together with a right of way to and from said wharf, landing and sheds. Said landing, furnace, sheds, etc. shall be kept in proper repair by said Spratt. Said wharf and conveyance shall be provided with covered shutters to prevent paper and other matter from blowing away or falling into the sea while loading. Said Spratt shall cause to be constructed a gate at the head of said wharf and landing which shall be securely fastened at all hours, except the hours specified herein, for receiving said garbage.

Fourth: -

That the said Spratt will receive garbage at the above described landing and wharf during the term aforesaid on each regular day thereof, as follows:

Between the hours of four o'clock and ten o'clock a. m. and between the hours of five o'clock and ten o'clock P. M. for the first five months of each year, beginning with June, and between the hours of eight o'clock a. m. and four o'clock P. M. for the remainder of said year of said term.

Fifth:

That said garbage shall be destroyed and dumped into the sea as aforesaid, at least once every day during the first seven months of said term, unless in the judgment of the Board of Health, it shall be on account of stress of weather or for other reasons, impossible to do so.

Sixth:

The conveyance used for conveying garbage and the wharf, landing and surroundings shall be kept as clean as possible, and to the reasonable satisfaction of the Board of Health, and when said conveyance leaves the wharf loaded, it shall proceed at once and dump at the buoy above mentioned, weather permitting, such dumping, weather permitting, shall be done within an hour before or after high water.

Seventh:

That the word "Garbage" as herein used, shall include all kinds of refuse or decaying vegetables, animal or mineral matters, including brush, and waste from lawns, except dead horses, cows and hogs. No garbage shall be left on the wharf before putting into the conveyance or furnace, during the five months of said year, beginning with June, except as long as may be necessary to separate it. Said Spratt agrees that he will destroy or dispose of dead horses, cows, and hogs for a reasonable compensation in addition to the compensation provided by this contract. But the party of the second part shall not be liable to pay anything beyond what is herein expressly agreed to pay. The party of the second part in consideration of the agreement made by the party of the first part, agrees with the party of the first part that it will pay for the destruction and removal of garbage as aforesaid the sum of twenty-six hundred and fifty dollars (\$2650.00) for year of said term. Said sum shall be paid in payments as follows: \$220.00, May 1, 1915; \$220.00, June 1, 1915; \$220.00, July 1, 1915; \$220.00, August 1, 1915; \$220.00, September 1, 1915; \$220.00, October 1, 1915; \$220.00, November 1, 1915; \$220.00, December 1, 1915; \$220.00, January 1, 1916; \$220.00, February 1, 1916; \$220.00, March 1, 1916; \$220.00, April 1, 1916.

It is mutually agreed by the parties hereto that the said party of the first part shall not be bound to receive garbage at other hours than those specified, during the aforesaid term, to wit: Between four and ten o'clock a. m. and between five and ten o'clock P. M. on each regular day of five months of said year beginning with June, and between the hours of eight o'clock a. m. and six o'clock P. M. on each regular day of the other seven months of said year of said term.

And the party of the first part shall not be required to maintain a conveyance for transportation of said garbage after said first five months, beginning with June of said year of said term, providing it is properly disposed of to the satisfaction of the Board of Health, and shall not be bound to receive dead horses, cows or hogs, and destroy and dispose of the same without being paid a reasonable sum therefor by the person or persons depositing said horses, cows or hogs at said landing, wharf or shed in addition to the compensation herein provided.

In case said Spratt or his representatives, shall fail or refuse to perform this contract to the satisfaction of the Board of Health, as herein provided, the Board of Health

may take possession of the said Spratt's wharf, landing, sheds, conveyance, furnace and other apparatus (authority for the purpose being hereby given) and having so taken possession, they may, at the expense of said Spratt, employ any person or persons to dispose of said garbage as herein provided; or in case of such failure or refusal they may, at the expense of said Spratt employ any person or persons to so dispose of said garbage without taking possession of said wharf, landing, sheds and other apparatus. In case the expense of removal by such person or persons shall in either case exceed the balance that may be then due said Spratt on this contract, he, the said Spratt, agrees that he will reimburse said Town to the end that the cost of removal of garbage as herein provided, shall not exceed for the term hereof the sum hereby agreed to be paid. The Municipal Officer of the said town of Eden, may license any person to do the acts specified in Sections one and two of this By-Laws on the payment of one dollar for such license and for any violation of this ordinance any person found guilty thereof shall be subject to a penalty of five dollars for each offense.

Adoption of By-law.

At a meeting of the Local Board of Health of the Town of Eden, Hancock County, Maine, held in the First National Bank Building in Bar Harbor, on the ninth day of April, 1915, at which meeting the entire Board was present and acted, it was unanimously voted to amend Article No. 9 of the Sanitary Laws of said Eden, which now reads as follows, to wit:

Article 9. No person shall, without a license from the Local Board of Health, keep on his premises or have in his possession pigs at any time, and no person shall without such license keep on his premises or have in his possession, hens, ducks, geese or fowl of any kind during the months of May, June, July, August and September, by striking out all of the words after the word "pigs" in the third line, to and including the word "possession" in the fourth line, and by striking out all the words after the word "kind" in the fifth line, so that said Article 9 as amended shall read as follows:

Article 9. No person shall, without a license from the Local Board of Health, keep on his premises or have in his possession, pigs, hens, ducks, geese or fowl of any kind.

It was unanimously resolved by said Board that said By-law as amended is necessary and proper for the preservation of life and health and the successful operation of the health laws of the State, and it was unanimously voted to make and adopt said Article 9 as amended as a By-law of said Town of Eden.
